He expected a key work in underpinning of the National Power Grid System, Central Water Irrigation, Navigation Commission, Damodar valley adventure, Hirakud errand and Sone stream adventure.

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's Early Life and Education:-

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was brought into the world on fourteenth April 1891 at Mahu in Madhya Pradesh. His local was Ambawade close to Dapoli in Ratnagiri area, in Maharashtra. His mom Bhimabai kicked the bucket in his initial age and his dad Ramaji tended him while filling in as a 'Significant' in Army. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar finished his essential schooling at Satara in Maharashtra. As a piece of his affection for his instructor, he changed his family name Ambawadekar to Ambedkar. His dad moved to Mumbai, where Dr. B.R. Ambedkar finished his Matriculation. At Mumbai, he became capable in English language, through his wide perusing, support and motivation of his dad. He further looked for confirmation at Elphistan College, where the Maharaja Sayajirao Gaikwad of Baroda offered him Twenty Five Thousand as a Scholarship to help Bhimrao. He finished his B.A. from Elphistan College, in 1912. He endured as being called as 'unapproachable' while he was taking instruction at Satara and Mumbai. That experiencing made himself to foster his character by confronting the desolations of social segregation as an 'unapproachable'. That was the defining moment in his own life which drove him to shape his brain and mind to be humanistic for those confronting comparable circumstance such as himself. Going against the norm, he met the extraordinary individuals like Maharaja Sayajirao Gaikwad of Baroda who endorsed grant for him to finish his three years in America. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar humanistic nature incorporates the impact of the philanthropic perspectives on individuals like Maharaja Sayajirao Gaikwad. With the motivation of such extraordinary individuals, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar concentrated on Economics, Sociology and Political Science and got PhD of Columbia University in 1915 on "Exchange Ancient India".

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's Later Life and Education:-

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar became thoughtful towards the down trampled and the untouchables in his later life. He finished M.Sc from London School of Economics and Political Science by requiring one year's grant from Maharaja Sayajirao Gaikwad. He acknowledged the assistance of Baroda State, when he got back from London. There he was given awful treatment by different authorities he being an 'unapproachable' from down trampled (Dalit) family. That expanded and he needed to surrender that work and turned into a teacher of Economics in Sidenham College of Commerce in Mumbai. This very year (1919) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar started to participate in everyday public activity. He partook the gatherings of Eradication of Untouchability, which were held at Mangaon and Nagpur in Maharashtra. Those gatherings ended up being the following stages in his accomplishments as the most humanistic discouraged (dalit) pioneer. At one side, training impacted him and at other his socio-political vocation outlined his personality to be more humanistic, towards the retrogressive of India. Further, Chatrapati Rajashri Shahu Maharaj of Kolhapur showed his compassion and humankind towards.

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar to give him grant to go to London and to get D.Sc degree on "Issue of Rupee" and to be a Barister in 1923. In 1924 he functioned as a Lawyer in the High court in Mumbai. From that exact second he gave his leftover life to work for the cancelation of Untouchabality in India. He laid out the "Bahishkrit Hitkarini Sabha" on twentieth July 1924. The major humanistic targets of that association were to instruct the untouchables, to empower the untouchables by joining them to

make peaceful battle for the social and financial privileges and equity and to make developments for their equivalent freedoms. The freedom and balance of the retrogressive, discouraged and untouchables were the points of every one of his endeavors and exercises done by him all through his life. Every one of his deeds show his compassion, empathy, love, dedication and mankind towards the people who were away from any open door in their lives many years throughout the entire existence of India. He trained his kin to go against the treachery done to them. He made mindfulness, fearlessness and self pride among them. He instructed to help their freedoms through the peaceful battles and developments. Indeed, even in the battle he focused on the significance of the humanistic viewpoint, resistance and persistence. He focused on the significance of the retrogressive in their viewpoints and conduct.

Humanistic Activities of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar;-

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar cleaned the Mahad Lake on 25th and 26th Dec. 1927 and liberated it for the down trampled and the regressive. He consumed the most questionable "Manu Smriti" on 25th Dec. 1927, which supported the bondage of 'shudras' (dalits) and ladies class of society. He did 'Satyagrah' for passage in the sanctuary at parvati for the down trampled. He began Reading Rooms and Libraries for the grown-ups and began grown-up schools on twentieth July 1924. He laid out the 'People groups Education Society' in 1946. He laid out Sidharth Mahavidyalaya at Mumbai and Milind Mahavidyalaya at Aurangabad. He began the day to day news paper 'Muknayak' in 1920 and 'Bahishkrit Bharat' in 1927 and 'Samata' in 1928. He examined the issues of treachery done to the down trampled (dalits) in those news papers. He functioned as the Minister of Law in the British Government and worked of the untouchables. On the flaws in schooling system, banns on Wine, downsides of Budget, Primary training and so on. The addressed the down trampled (dalits) in the first 'Round-table Conference' held in 1930 at London and recounted the thoughtful accounts of the enduring of the retrogressive there. The untouchables got discrete held bodies electorate in 1932 when Ramsey Macdonald Published 'Jatiya Niwada' against which M.K. Gandhi abstained saying that, that was the division between the Hindus and the untouchables. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar lay out discrete 'Majoor Party' and won 13 seats in the appointment of 1937, and voiced for the privileges of ranchers and workers in the Legislative Assembly. He turned into the head of the discouraged (dalits) when he laid out "All India Scheduled Caste Federation" and won 13 seats in 1952 political race. He went against the Krips Mission, Cabinet Mission and Wevhel Yojana which were against the freedoms of poor people and oppressed. He turned into the Minister of Law in the Ministery of Pandit Nehru in fifteenth August 1947, and effectively satisfied the obligation as the President of Masuda Samati and gave the best 'Indian Constitution to India'. The Indian Constitution is the best illustration of the statement of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar humanistic standpoint shown in regards to all the retrogressive known and obscure who were away from all sort of progress and advancement. He found it hard to get compassionate right to untouchables living in Hindu Religion, so he surrendered Hindu religion and pronounced in a gathering on thirteenth October 193.5 at Yewala saying, "I won't pass on as a Hindu". He left Hindu religion on fourteenth October 1956.

Conclusion:-

The humanistic disposition shown by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in the field of social improvement is his novel work. He consumed his time on earth to make and empower the untouchables to live as a free individual leaving the reliant and powerless life. He attempted to join the regressive and to container a development to get their legitimate freedoms. He trained all to live as an individual. It was the message of the Buddha religion. The insurgency made by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar is communicated through the constitution of India. He makes conscious the 'human' in the untouchables to carry on with life in pride. This is most unchangeable get-together. Dr. Ambedkar's was a short life however at that point a generally striking one. He rose from buildup, from being managed more terrible than an animal to transforming into the father of the Indian Constitution. Dr. Ambedkar was actually a diverse character. The establishment was established by him with the end goal of advancing higher education among the lower working classes and particularly among the planned positions. Later on the P.E.S started secondary schools, night secondary schools, inns, universities and different establishments. However he started the People's Education Society, still he had the perspective that the more noteworthy obligation for providing instructive open doors ought to be that of the Government.

He knew the importance of informal education along with formal education. He laid proper stress on technical and military education also. He encouraged co-curricular activities in all his institutions to enlarge the sphere of knowledge. He desired that the students studying in his institutions should come out with fully developed personality in all respects. In fulfillment of this ideal; he established a College Parliament in Siddharth College of Arts and Science.

His views about education of women may be controversial today, but they might be relevant to that time. The modem concept of education is comprehensive and lays more stress on the all-round development of a child. Dr. Ambedkar also believed in this concept. He was persistent that Government should give special facilities to the Backward Class students; at the same time he was of the opinion that the Backward Classes should make their progress themselves. Thus he was one of the great educationists of India. He believed that education was one of the strongest means to uplift his community as well as the whole nation. For Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, education was the main key to open the doors of light, vision and wisdom. Take education, be united and do the struggle" is the main message of his to the society and nation. He says that education and society have a bounded relationship because the progress and development of society is possible only through education. The power of making the man free from exploitation and slavery comes from education. He believed that education can act as an change agent to bring equality in the society. He had done plentiful to awake the depressed class, to make them aware of their situation, to raise their voice and showed them education as a path for their political, economical and social upliftment. He motivated the Dalits to merge with the upper caste in social, economic and political aspects through the slogan of educate, agitate and organise. Also he ensured educational rights of all sections of Indian society by providing certain rights under the Article 30 and 29 in Indian constitution.

- ❖ The idea of systems can be applied at an organizational level. In applying system concepts, organizations are taken into account and not only the objectives and performances of different departments (subsystems).

Concept of Contingency Approach

- ❖ The contingency approach is the latest approach to the existing management approaches. During the 1970's, contingency theory was developed by J.W. Lorsch and P.R. Lawrence, who were critical of other approaches presupposing one best way to manage. Management problems are different under different situations and require to be tackled as per the demand of the situation.
- Contingency theory is a problem-solving approach which considers all major factors in a situation before making a decision (Higgins, J.M, 1991). It has been used in recent years to replace the simplistic principles of management with more integrated ones. Simplistic principles provide insight about management and employees within the organization, but they are often incomplete. Many of the early management principles and organizational theories were assumed to be universal. Through the years, research has shown that there are situations and conditions which support the need for a more integrated approach.
- The contingency approach as proposed by organizational theorists such as Lawrence and Lorsch (1969 and Schein (1972) attempted to implement a variety of concepts from other approaches. They found that the effectiveness of their techniques changed from one situation to another. Organizations and their subsystems proved to be unique. This provided the base for designing and managing organizations individually.
- ❖ Contingency management stresses the need for appraisal and analysis of the entire managerial environment within the organization. The appraisal and analysis are done in order to determine what work features, technology, personnel and organizational designs need to be considered as most fitting for particular circumstances.
- The contingency or situational approach emphasizes the fact that what managers do in practice depends upon a given set of circumstances (a contingency & situation). This approach not only takes into account given situations but also the influence of given solution on behavior patterns of an enterprise. As per this approach, managers should develop variable methods, tools or action plans as per the specific situation or contingencies as they develop. The type of motivation, communication system, type of leadership in an organization will depend upon the

circumstances prevailing in different enterprises at different times. Changes in organization have to be made to face the contingencies that crop up from time to time. A manager should study to find out the method that fits into the situation and helps in precise realization of goals of the enterprise.

The Changing Contexts of Management Practice Perhaps the principal change in the context of managing over the last few centuries – even more than the changes in IT and other technologies – is the erosion of business's monopoly powers, in part because of the loss of government grants and charters and the growth of government intervention with antitrust legislation and regulations, and in part because of globalization, competition, and greater consumer choice. Without citing much historical evidence, many academics pronounce business has become 'hypercompetitive.' We also hear that managers' power within firms has changed from eighteenth century Dickensian absolutism to the bargaining situation exemplified, perhaps, in German Mittlestand firms. Even if these changes have indeed occurred it does not follow that they have made managing more difficult, perhaps the opposite. As the economy develops an 'invisible hand' appears in the background, the deus ex machina in the business drama that takes charge when markets are 'efficient.' As information flows improve and transaction costs drop 'efficient markets' emerge, an ordering that is not the artifact of individuals, managers, or the state. Many argue market forces should be our socioeconomy's dominating mode of ordering, buttressing our democratic politics and our ethics of independence. Management's role then narrows onto reading and following, as rationally as possible, markets they neither engineer nor command. Social and political power is downplayed and becomes suspect as 'interference' in efficient markets. So one history of managing is of moving our economic affairs into increasingly efficient markets in which rationality dominates judgment.

One best way of doing may be useful for repetitive things but not for managerial problems. The contingency theory aims at integrating theory with practice in systems framework. The behavior of an organization is said to be contingent on forces of environment. "Hence, a contingency approach is an approach, where behavior of one sub-unit is dependent on its environment and relationship to other units or sub-units that have some control over the sequences desired by that sub- unit."

More surprisingly, perhaps, is that worker education level is also positively associated with management scores, suggesting that implementing many of these practices may be easier when the workforce is more knowledgeable. Many of the best

Our belief is that more basic business education—for example, around capital budgeting, data analysis, and standard human resources practices—could help improve management in many countries. This holds particularly true in developing countries, and recent fieldwork we have been doing with firms in India has provided supportive evidence on this.

Contingent Management Thus far, we have assumed that certain management practices are, on average, productivity enhancing. From this perspective, management resembles a technology, and there can be technical progress in management, just as there is for machines. An alternative perspective is that all management practices are contingent on the firm's environment. Every organization is optimally adopting its own best practices given the circumstance it finds itself in. There is certainly some element of contingency in management choices in at least three respects. First, different countries specialize in different aspects of the managerial practices.

There are a few possible explanations for this: It may be due to cultural differences across countries (possibly because Asian culture is claimed to be more "collectivist") or historical differences (the lack of capital after the Second World War is argued to have forced Japanese firms to develop monitoring-focused lean production techniques). Second, many aspects of strategic management—such as pricing or takeover decisions—will be very contingent on specific circumstances the organization faces, with no typical or generally accepted "good" or "bad" practice. This is why our survey looks at only a subset of the more process-oriented management practices where it is more likely that best practices exist. Third, the management practices we assess have not been equally beneficial throughout history. For example, rigorously and systematically using data to deal with issues and make decisions is facilitated by the dramatic drop in the real cost of information technology.

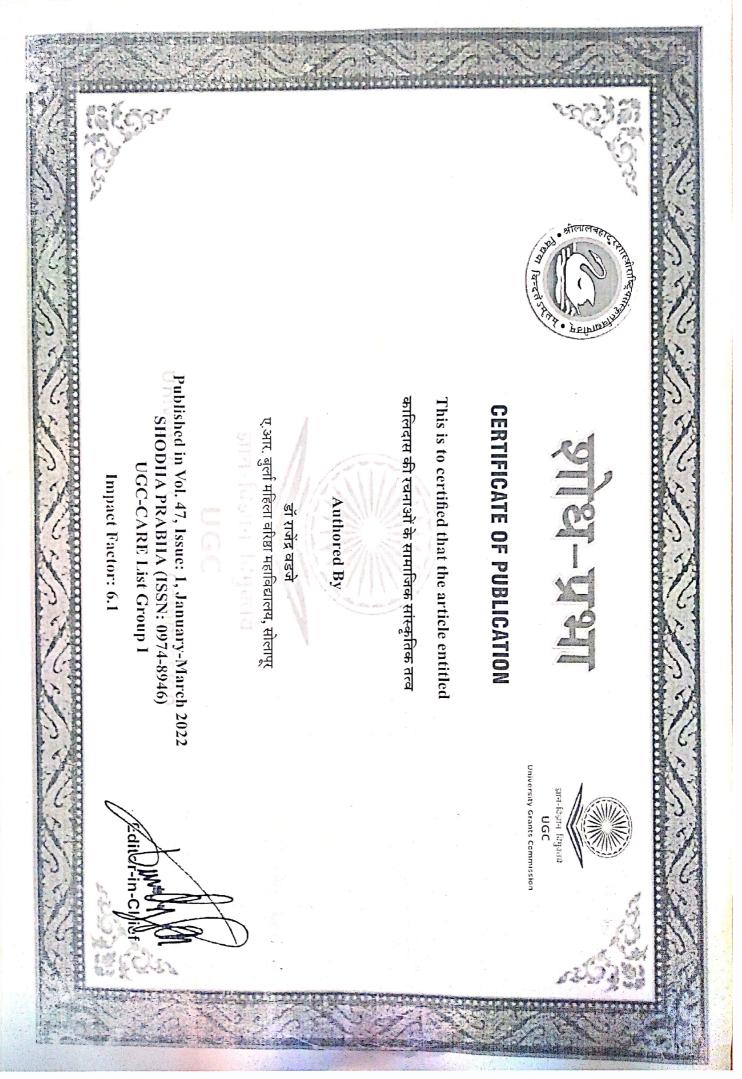

कविकुल गुरु महाकवि कालिदास ने तीन नाटकों अभिज्ञानशाकुन्तल , विक्रमोवंशोयम् तथा मालिवकाग्निमित्रम् के अतिरिक्त , रघुवंश , कुमारसम्भव , ऋतुसंहार और मेघदूत की रचना की है उसके समय और व्यक्तित्व के विषय में निश्चित रूप से कुछ भी पता नहीं है फिर भी कालिदास ने अपनी कृतियों में अपने समय के सारे भारतवर्ष का और इसके विभागों का नामोल्लेख किया है। उनका महाकाव्य रघुवंश अठारह सगों में लिखा हुआ महाकाव्य है। इसमें रघुकुल का वर्णन है। कथा और काव्यों में कालिदास ऐसी परमकोटि को प्राप्त हुए हैं जो उनसे पहले या बाद में और कोई प्राप्त नहीं कर सका है। रघुवंश का विषय विविध और व्यापक है जिससे कालिदास को अपनी कल्पना शक्ति प्रदर्शन करने का पूर्ण सुअवसर प्राप्त हुआ है। रघुवंश सूत्रबद्ध काव्य की अपेक्षा चित्रों की एक तेजोराशि है। कालिदास संस्कृत साहित्य के सर्वश्रेष्ठ किया है। वास्तव में , कालिदास संस्कृत साहित्य के मणिमाला का माध्यम है। पश्चिमी और भारतीय , प्राचीन और प्राचीन विद्वानों की दृष्टि में कालिदास सर्वश्रेष्ठ अद्वितीय किव हैं।

प्रस्तावना

अन्य किवयों की तुलना में उनकी बहुमुखी प्रतिभा उन्हें विशिष्टता प्रदान करती है। कुछ विद्वान उन्हें ईसा पूर्व दूसरी शताब्दी में सिद्ध करते हैं, जबिक छठी शताब्दी ईस्वी में, अधिकांश विद्वानों के अनुसार, कालिदास का जन्म उज्जियनी में हुआ था और वे शैव धर्मवल्मी थे। अधिकांश इतिहासकारों का मानना है कि कालिदास गुप्त किव थे और गुप्त सम्राट चंद्रगुप्त द्वितीय विक्रमादित्य के समकालीन थे। इस लेख में, हम संस्कृत के महान किव कालिदास के जीवन परिचय, जीवनी, साहित्य, काव्य सौंदर्य और समाजशास्त्रीय तत्वों के बारे में अध्ययन करेंगे, इसिलए शोध पत्र में हम कालिदास के कार्यों और साहित्य में उनके योगदान का अध्ययन कर रहे हैं।

कालिदास सुघटित वर्णनों के लिए आख्यान विषयक अभिरुचि का हनन कभी नहीं करते हैं। हृदयंगमता और अभिरुचि के लिए उनकी अपनी निश्चितता है। सचमुच कालिदास में भी अन्य संस्कृत किवयों की तरह अपने पात्रों की ' सर्वधाभद्र ' पात्रों के रूप में चित्रण करने की प्रवृत्ति विद्यमान है। फिर भी यह मानना होगा कि इन आदर्श पात्रों का अपना व्यक्तित्व है रघुवंश में कई विषय अद्भुत किव कल्पनाश्चित रीति और संगीत की शक्ति से आपस में ग्रथित हैं यह कहना अत्युक्ति नहीं होगा कि कुछ अपवादों को छोड़कर कालिदास को शब्दाडम्बर के कृत्रिम प्रयोग में अभिरुचि नहीं है। उसकी कृतियाँ मानव भावनाओं से पिरपूर्ण हैं। कालिदास को एक और कृति कुमारसम्भव महाकाव्य है जिसके आठ सर्ग हैं। रचना सम्पूर्ण नहीं है जिसका कोई ज्ञात कारण नहीं है। इसके आगे के सर्ग भी मिलते हैं परन्तु वे किसी अज्ञात के द्वारा लिखे गये समझ जाते हैं। काव्य मुख्य कथा से आरम्भ होता है। प्रथम सर्ग में हिमालय का वर्णन बहुत ही रमणीय है।

कालीदास की जन्मस्थली को लेकर भी विवाद है। मेघदूतम् में उज्जैन के प्रति उनके विशेष प्रेम को देखकर कुछ लोग उन्हें उज्जैन का निवासी मानते हैं। लेखकों ने यह साबित करने की भी कोशिश की है कि कालिदास का जन्म उत्तराखंड के रुद्रप्रयाग जिले के काविल्ठा गाँव में हुआ था। कालिदास ने अपनी प्रारंभिक शिक्षा यहाँ प्राप्त की और यहाँ उन्होंने मेघदूत, कुमारसंभव और रघुवंश जैसे महाकाव्यों की रचना की। कविल्ठा चारधाम यात्रा मार्ग पर गुप्तकाशी में स्थित है। गुप्तकाशी से कालीमठ सिद्धपीठ के रास्ते पर, कालीमठ मंदिर से चार किलोमीटर आगे कवेल्थ गाँव स्थित है। कवीलथा में, सरकार ने कालिदास की एक मूर्ति भी स्थापित की है और एक सभागार का निर्माण किया है जहाँ हर साल जून के महीने में तीन दिनों के लिए एक सेमिनार का आयोजन किया जाता है, जिसमें देश भर के विद्वान भाग लेते हैं।

कालिदास के रहने के कुछ प्रमाण बिहार के मधुबनी जिले में भी मिलते हैं। कहा जाता है कि विदोत्तमा (कालीदास की पत्नी) को बहस में हराने के बाद, कालिदास यहां गुरुकुल में रुके थे। कालिदास को यहां परमात्मा से ज्ञान का वरदान मिला था। आज भी, कालीदास की दीह यहाँ आयोजित की जाती है। मिट्टी से बच्चों के पहले अक्षर लिखने की परंपरा अभी भी यहां प्रचलित है। कुछ विद्वानों ने उन्हें बंगाल और उड़ीसा में भी सिद्ध करने की कोशिश की है। ऐसा कहा जाता है कि कालिदास की श्रीलंका में हत्या कर दी गई थी, लेकिन विद्वान भी इसे काल कल्पित मानते हैं।

अध्रा काव्य:—

यह काव्य अधूरा क्यों रहा यह समस्या बहुत ही उलझी हुई है। हो सकता है कि यह हस्तलिखित प्रति में नष्ट हो गया हो या सम्भव है कि कवि ने इस काव्य को अपने समकालीन पण्डितों को आलोचना के कारण अधूरा ही छोड़ दिया हो। चूँकि रघुवंश बाद की रचना है , यह कहना युक्तिसंगत नहीं होगा कि किव की मृत्यु के कारण यह काव्य पूरा नहीं हो सका , निःसंदेह कवि द्वितीय भाग पूरा करने की प्रतिज्ञा पहले भाग में कर चुके हैं।

महाकवि कालिदास के विचार

महाकवि कालिदास रचनाओं में तत्कालीन वेदादिशास्त्र प्रतिपादित धर्म के सिद्धान्त मिलते हैं वह चार वर्णों और चार आश्रमों के पक्षपाती हैं। उन्होंने आदर्श ब्राह्मण और आदर्श क्षत्रिय का वर्णन किया है। जीवन के चार पुरुषार्थों धर्म , अर्थ , काम और मोक्ष में उनका पूर्ण विश्वास है। यद्यपि कालिदास ने प्रेम संबंधी चित्रों को चित्रित किया है परन्तु वे इंद्रियपरक नहीं है शास्त्रों के अनुसार पुत्र प्राप्ति आवश्यक है। कालिदास ने रघुवंश के आरम्भ में स्पष्ट कहा है रघुवंशी पुत्र प्राप्ति के लिए गृहस्थ जीवन को स्वीकार करते थे। ऐसा ज्ञात होता है कि कालिदास ब्रह्मा , विष्णु और शिव तीनों देवों की पारमार्थिक एकता का तथा जगत् - प्रकृति के बारे में सांख्य और योगदर्शन के सिद्धान्तों। मानने वाले हैं। उन्होंने कई बार तीन गुणों का उल्लेख किया है तथा कुछ योगासनों का भी निरूपण किया है। प्रो कीथ का कथन है कि कालिदास में मानव हृदय के द्वंद्वों का कोई समाधान शोध-प्रभा (ISSN: 0974-8946)

सम्भव नहीं है। उनके अनुसार कालिदास ब्राह्मण धर्म का प्रतिनिधित्व करते हैं। इस कारण से कई पाश्चात्य विद्वान् कालिदास की रचनाओं की आलोचना करते हैं किन्तु भारतीय सहृदय को कालिदास की कृतियां अत्यधिक प्रभावित करती जिनमें कर्म तथा पुनर्जन्म सिद्धान्तों में पूर्ण विश्वास प्रकट किया गया है।

कालिदास के लिए संसार पाप और व्यथा का स्थान नहीं है यहाँ सौन्दर्य तथा हर्ष विराजमान है। उन्होंने प्रकृति के परम आनन्ददायी रूप का वर्णन किया है। सौन्दर्य की उनकी अपनी कल्पनाएं हैं। कालिदास के अनुसार सौन्दर्य वर्णनातीत है, केवल हृदय से ही उसका अनुभव हो सकता है। कालिदास को प्रशंसा पूर्वीय तथा पश्चिमीय विद्वानों ने समान रूप से की है। प्राकृतिक सौन्दर्य का मानवीय भावनाओं के साथ एकीकरण करने के लिए कालिदास प्रशंसा के पात्र हैं। उसने ऐसे अनुपम काव्य का निर्माण किया है जिसमें मानव - हितवाद, अद्भुत कल्पनावाद तथा प्रकृति प्रेम का चित्रण है। काव्य के प्रधान अंग शब्द रचना कल्पना और ध्विन आदि सभी उनकी रचनाओं में रमणीय रूप से विद्यमान है। कालिदास में श्रुतिकटु तथा असंस्कृत कुछ भी नहीं पाया जाता। उनके काव्य की एक और विशेषता यह है कि वे वाच्य की अपेक्षा ध्विन का अधिक प्रयोग करते है। कुमारसम्भव के निम्नलिखित से उनकी व्यंजनाशक्ति का पता चलता है। जिसमें पार्वती संभ्रान्त स्थिति में दिखाई गई है—

महाकवि कालिदास का जीवन परिचय –

महाकिव कालिदास का जीवन परिचय (Kalidas Biography in Hindi) – कालिदास भारत के श्रेष्टतम किवयों में से एक थे. यह संस्कृत भाषा के विद्वान भी थे. इनको राजा विक्रमादित्य के दरबार के नौरत्न में शामिल किया गया था. श्रींगार रस की रचनाओं के लिए जाने जाते हैं. इन्होंनें श्रृंगार रस की रचनाए इस प्रकार की हैं. की जो एक बार पढ़ ले वह अपने आप इनके भाव से जागृत हो जाएगा. इन्होंनें अपने साहित्य में आदर्शवादी और नैतिक मूल्य का विशेष ध्यान रखा हैं. इनकी रचनाओं को कई भाषा में प्रकाशित किया गया हैं. उनकी रचनाएँ भारत की पौराणिक कथाओं पर आधारित हैं. अभिज्ञानशाकुन्तल इनकी सबसे ज्यादा प्रसिद्ध रचना हैं. इनके दुवरा लिखे गए नाटक को विश्व के अनेकों भाषा में अनुवाद किया गया हैं.

कालिदास के जन्म को लेकर कोई ठोस साबुत और जानकारी या कोई दस्तावेज नहीं हैं. अनेक विद्वानों का इनके जन्म को लेकर अलग – अलग मत हैं. कुछ विद्वान दुवारा 150 ईप्॰ से लेकर 400 ई॰ के बीच कालिदास के जन्म को माना जाता हैं. कुछ विद्वानों दुवारा तो गुप्त काल के समय को इनका जन्म माना जाता हैं. क्योंकि कालिदास के नाटक 'मालविकाग्निमित्र' में अग्निमित्र का वर्णन मिलता हैं. जो 170 ईप्॰ का शासक था. एक और कालिदास का उल्लेख वानभट्ट की 'हर्षचरितम' में मिलती हैं. जो छठी शताब्दी की रचना हैं. इसलिए इन सभी साक्ष्य को मानकर कालिदास के जन्म का समय पहली शताब्दी

कालिदास की रचनाएँ

कालिदास ने अनेकों रचनाएँ लिखी हैं. जिनमे से कुछ बहुत ही सर्वश्रेष्ठ रचनाएँ मानी जाती हैं. आपको कालिदास दुआरा लिखी गई कुछ महत्वपूर्ण रचनाओं की लिस्ट निचे दी गई हैं. विद्योत्तमा से शादी की इच्छा रखने वाले बहुत सरे विद्वान विद्योत्तमा से शास्त्रार्थ में में हार गए. इसलिए कुछ विद्वान ने मिलकर अपने हार का बदला लेने के लिए कालिदास का शास्त्रार्थ विद्योत्तमा से कराया. कालिदास एक मुर्ख व्यक्ति थे. क्योंकिं जब सारे विद्वान मिलकर एक अज्ञानी मुर्ख की तलास कर रहे थे. तब उन्हें कालिदास दिखाई दिए जो पेड़ की जिस टहनी पर बैठे थे उसी को काट रहे थे. तब सभी को लगा इससे ज्यादा मुर्ख

कुमारसंभव :-

यह एक महाकाव्य हैं. इस महाकाव्य में पार्वती विवाह, कुमार जन्म, तारकासुर वध की कथा प्रमुख हैं, शेष प्रासंगिक कथायें हैं. इस महाकाव्य में 17 सर्ग हैं. परन्तु कुछ विद्वान् इनमें से प्रथम आठ को ही प्रमाणिक मानते हैं, शेष सर्गों को विद्वानों द्वारा बाद में जोड़ा हुआ माना गया हैं. उदात्त, सरस एवं कोमल भावाभिव्यक्ति, स्वाभाविक एवं मंजुल कल्पनाएँ, कोमलकांत पदावली, अलंकारों का सहज स्वाभाविक प्रयोग, प्रकृति का सुरग्य चित्रण, तप, समाधि, संयोग, वियोग आदि का वर्णन इस काव्य की प्रमुख विशेषताएं हैं. कुमारसंभव कालिदास की उत्कृष्ट कोटि की रचना हैं.

रघुवंश :

रघुवंश महाकाव्य कालिदास एक उत्कृष्ट कृति है। सूर्यवंशी के 30 राजाओं का इस महाकाव्य के 19 सर्गों में वर्णन किया है। रघुवंश महाकाव्य में, एक वंश के कई नायकों को एक नायक के चिरत्र के आधार के रूप में चित्रित किया गया है। रघुवंश के 19 सर्गों में सूर्यवंशी राजाओं दिलीप से राम और राम के वंशजों का चित्र चित्रण है। इस महाकाव्य के पहले 9 सर्गों में, राम के चार पूर्वजों दिलीप, रघु, अज और दशरथ का वर्णन मिलता है और दसवें सर्ग से 15 वें सर्ग तक के 6 सर्गों में राम के जीवन वृत्त का वर्णन है। 16 वें सर्ग से 18 वें सर्ग तक के चार सर्गों में राम के वंशजों का वर्णन मिलता हैं। 19 वें सर्ग में कामुक अग्निवर्ण का वर्णन मिलता हैं। इस काव्य में सभी रसों का सुंदर वर्णन है। रघु और राम के युद्ध कथाओं में, जहाँ वीर रस का चित्रण किया गया है, वहां आर्त विलाप में करुण रस की अजस्र धारा प्रवाहित होती हैं।

रघु वंश में किव द्वारा एक से एक सुंदर आदर्श प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं। रघुवंश के पास रघु के बेटे अज की इंदुमती से शादी, इंदुमती की मृत्यु और अज के करुण विलाप, राम और सीता के पुष्पक विमान द्वारा प्राकृतिक दृश्यों का वर्णन आदि का एक आकर्षक चित्रण है।

कालिदास का काव्य सौंदर्य:

कालिदास अपनी विषय - वस्तु देश की सांस्कृतिक विरासत से लेते हैं और उसे वे अपने उद्देश्य की प्राप्ति के अनुरूप ढाल देते हैं। उदाहरणार्थ , अभिज्ञान शाकुन्तल की कथा में शकुन्तला चतुर , सांसारिक युवा नारी है और दुष्यन्त स्वार्थी प्रेमी है। इसमें किव तपोवन की कन्या में प्रेमभावना के

प्रथम प्रस्फुटन से लेकर वियोग, कुण्ठा आदि की अवस्थाओं में से होकर उसे उसकी समग्रता तक दिखाना चाहता है। उन्हीं के शब्दों में नाटक में जीवन की विविधता होनी चाहिए और उसमें विभिन्न रुचियों के व्यक्तियों के लिए सौंदर्य और माधुर्य होना चाहिए।

> त्रैगुण्योद्भवम् अत्र लोक - चिरतम् नानृतम् दृश्यते। नाट्यम् भिन्न - रुचेर जनस्य बहुधापि एकम् समाराधनम्।।

कालिदास के जीवन के बारे में हमें विशेष जानकारी नहीं है। उनके नाम के बारे में अनेक किवदिन्तयां प्रचलित हैं जिनका कोई ऐतिहासिक मूल्य नहीं है। उनकी कृतियों से यह विदित होता है कि वे ऐसे युग में रहे जिसमें वैभव और सुख-सुविधाएं थीं। संगीत तथा नृत्य और चित्र-कला से उन्हें विशेष प्रेम था। तत्कालीन ज्ञान-विज्ञान, विधि और दर्शन-तंत्र तथा संस्कारों का उन्हें विशेष ज्ञान था। उन्होंने भारत की व्यापक यात्राएं कीं और वे हिमालय से कन्याकुमारी तक देश की भौगोलिक स्थिति से पूर्णतः परिचित प्रतीत होते हैं। हिमालय के अनेक चित्रांकन जैसे विवरण और केसर की क्यारियों के चित्रण (जो कश्मीर में पैदा होती है) ऐसे हैं जैसे उनसे उनका बहुत निकट का परिचय है। जो बात यह महान कलाकार अपनी लेखिनी के स्पर्श मात्र से कह जाता है, अन्य अपने विशद वर्णन के उपरांत भी नहीं कह पाते। कम शब्दों में अधिक भाव प्रकट कर देने और कथन की स्वाभाविकता के लिए कालिदास प्रसिद्ध हैं। उनकी उक्तियों में ध्विन और अर्थ का तादात्मय मिलता है। उनके शब्द -चित्र सौन्दर्यमय और सर्वांगीण सम्पूर्ण हैं, जैसे दृ एक पूर्ण गतिमान राजसी रथ (विक्रमोवंशीय, 1.4), दौड़ते हुए मृग - शावक (अभिज्ञान - शाकुन्तल, 1.7), उर्वशी का फूट - फूटकर आंसू बहाना (विक्रमोवंशीय,

छन्द 15), चलायमान कल्पवृक्ष की भांति अन्तरिक्ष में नारद का प्रकट होना (विक्रमोर्वशीय, छन्द 19)।

सांस्कृतिक एवं सामाजिक तत्त्व:

उपमा और रूपकों के प्रयोग में वे सर्वोपरि हैं।

कालिदास के समृद्ध और उज्ज्वल व्यक्तित्व को एक महान सांस्कृतिक विरासत द्वारा चिह्नित किया गया है और उन्होंने अपने कार्यों में मुक्ति, व्यवस्था और प्रेम के आदर्शों को अभिव्यक्ति दी है। उन्होंने व्यक्ति को दुनिया के दुखों और संघर्षों से अवगत कराने के लिए प्यार, वासना, इच्छा - आकांक्षा, आशा - सपना, सफलता, असफलता आदि की अभिव्यक्ति दी है। भारत ने अपनी समग्रता में जीवन को देखा है और इसमें किसी भी विखंडन का विरोध किया है। किव ने आत्मा को विभाजित करने वाले मानसिक द्वंद्व का वर्णन किया है और इस प्रकार हमें इसे समग्रता में देखने में मदद मिली है। कालिदास की रचनाएँ हमारे लिए सुंदरता, साहसिक घटनाओं, त्याग के दृश्यों और मानव मन की बदलती स्थितियों के लिए संरक्षित करती हैं। उनके कार्यों को हमेशा मानव भाग्य के एक अवर्णनीय चित्रण के लिए पढ़ा जाएगा, क्योंकि केवल एक महान किव ही ऐसी प्रस्तुतियां दे सकता है। उनकी अनेक पंक्तियां संस्कृत में सूक्तियां बन गई हैं। उनका मानना है कि हिमालयी क्षेत्र में विकसित संस्कृति दुनिया की संस्कृतियों

वह जो चरम सत्य है सभी अज्ञान से परे हैं और वह आत्मा और पदार्थ के विभाजन से ऊपर है। वह सर्वज्ञ, सर्वव्यापक और सर्वशक्तिमान है। वह अपने को तीन रूपों में व्यक्त करता है (विमूर्ति) ब्रह्मा, विष्णु और शिव टू कन्ता, पालक तथा संहारका ये देव समाज पद वाले हैं आम जीवन में कालिदास शिवतंत्र के उपासक हैं। तीनों नाटकों टू अभिज्ञान शाकुन्तल, विक्रमोर्वशीय, मालविकाग्निमित्र टू की आरम्भिक प्रार्थनाओं से प्रकट होता है कि कालिदास शिव - उपासक थे। देखिए रघुवंश के आरम्भिक श्लोक में:

जगतः पितरौ बन्दे पार्वती - परमेश्वरौ।

यद्यपि कालिदास परमात्मा के शिव रूप के उपासक हैं, उनका दृष्टिकोण संकीर्ण नहीं है। परम्परागत हिन्दू धर्म के प्रति उनका दृष्टिकोण उदार है। वह दूसरों की मान्यताओं को सम्मान के साथ देखता था। कालिदास में सभी धर्मों के प्रति सहानुभूति है और वह शातिरता और कष्टरता से मुक्त है। कोई भी व्यक्ति उस मार्ग को चुन सकता है जो अच्छा लगता है क्योंकि अंततः भगवान के विभिन्न रूप एक ही भगवान के विभिन्न रूप हैं जो सभी रूपों में निराकार हैं। कालिदास पुनर्जन्म के सिद्धांत का पालन करते हैं। यह जीवन में पूर्णता के मार्ग का एक चरण है। जिस तरह हमारा वर्तमान जीवन पिछले कर्मों का फल है, उसी तरह हम इस जन्म में प्रयासों से अपने भविष्य को बेहतर बना सकते हैं। विश्व पर सदाचार का शासन है। विजय अन्ततः अच्छाई की होगी। यदि कालिदास की रचनाएँ दर्दनाक नहीं हैं तो उसका कारण यह है कि वह सद्धाव और शालीनता के अंतिम सत्य को स्वीकार करते हैं। इस विश्वास के तहत, वे ज्यादातर पुरुषों और महिलाओं के दुखों के लिए हमारी सहानुभूति को मोड़ देते हैं।

कालिदास के लेखन ने इस भ्रांति को दूर किया कि हिंदू मन ने ज्ञान और ध्यान पर अधिक ध्यान दिया और सांसारिक दुखों की उपेक्षा की। कालिदास के अनुभव का क्षेत्र विस्तृत था। उन्होंने समान रूप से जीवन, लोक, चित्रों और फूलों का आनंद लिया। उसने मनुष्य को सृष्टि (ब्रह्मांड) और धर्म की शिक्तयों से अलग नहीं देखा। उन्हें सभी प्रकार के मानवीय दुखों, आकांक्षाओं, क्षणिक खुशी और अंतहीन आशाओं का ज्ञान था।

सारांश

भारतीय रहस्यवादी और किव कबीर के जीवन के बारे में बहुत कम जानकारी है, ऐसा माना जाता है कि उनका जन्म बनारस में या उसके आसपास हुआ था। वह हिंदू तपस्वी रामानंद के शिष्य बनने से पहले मुस्लिम बुनकरों के पिरवार में पले-बढ़े। कबीर को सूफी और ब्राह्मण संत दोनों माना जाता है। कबीर दास दोहस दोहस (युगल) की प्रसिद्ध किवता I (अनुवाद के साथ 15 वीं शताब्दी के किव-संत कबीर के लिए जिम्मेदार कुछ ग्रंथों के उदाहरण पर, पेपर उत्तर आधुनिक दावे का विरोध करता है कि प्रत्येक प्राप्त संस्करण एक काव्य रूप से सुंदर, पॉलिश पाठ है। में सभी संभावनाएँ सभी प्राप्त संस्करण लेखन के लिए प्रतिबद्ध होने से पहले मौखिक प्रसारण के एक लंबे चरण से गुजरे हैं और वे कभी-कभी पाठ्य भ्रष्टाचार के परिणाम होते हैं जिसके परिणामस्वरूप असंगत पठन या काव्य ढीलापन और अतिरेक होता है। छंद के आधार पर और भिन्न संस्करणों की तुलना, कुछ पहले के पाठ का पुनर्निर्माण संभव है। यह तर्क दिया जाता है कि किवताओं की रचना एक मीट्रिक रूप से सही सस्वर पाठ के लिए की गई हो सकती है और जब वे संगीत के मूड और लय के लिए निर्धारित गीत बन गए तो उन्होंने गायकों द्वारा उपयोग किए गए लाइसेंस के तहत अपना सख्त छंद खो दिया है। प्रवर्धन उच्च स्तर पर भी पता लगाया जा सकता है क्योंकि कभी-कभी पूरी लाइनों का आविष्कार या उधार लिया गया था। प्रवर्धन के उदाहरणों का पता लगाकर a अधिक संक्षिप्त और अधिक शक्तिशाली प्रारंभिक पाठ का पुनर्निर्माण किया जा सकता है। बदले में प्रारंभिक पाठ का पुनर्निर्माण बाद के रूपों को एक दूसरे के साथ संबंध में स्थापित करने और 'भक्तिकरण' जैसे परिवर्तनों के पीछे वैचारिक प्रेरक शक्तियों को देखने का एक रास्ता खोल सकता है।

प्रस्तावना

संत कबीर भिक्त और सूफी आंदोलन के मध्यकालीन भारतीय संतों में से एक हैं। भिक्त आंदोलन हिंदू संतों द्वारा शुरू िकया गया था जबिक सूफी रहस्यवाद मध्यकालीन भारत (1200-1700) में मुस्लिम संतों द्वारा शुरू िकया गया था। कबीर ने भिक्त आंदोलन में बहुत योगदान दिया और उन्हें रिवदास, फरीद और नामदेव के साथ भिक्त का अग्रणी माना जाता है। दुख के मार्ग के रूप में प्रेम की उनकी अवधारणा संभवतः सूफियों के लिए कुछ हद तक ऋण का संकेत दे सकती है। नाथ परंपरा, भिक्त और सूफीवाद के इन और अन्य तत्वों, कबीर ने अपनी रहस्यमय प्रकृति के साथ मिलकर संश्लेषण िकया जो कबीर का विशिष्ट धर्म है। संत कबीर दास को उत्तरी भारत में भिक्त और सूफी आंदोलन का सबसे प्रभावशाली और सबसे उल्लेखनीय किव माना जाता है। वह पाखंड की प्रथा के सख्त खिलाफ थे और लोगों को दोहरा

मापदंड बनाए रखना पसंद नहीं करते थे। उन्होंने हमेशा लोगों को अन्य जीवित प्राणियों के प्रति दयालु होने और सच्चे प्रेम का अभ्यास करने का उपदेश दिया। उन्होंने हमेशा मोक्ष के साधन के रूप में कर्मकांड और तपस्वी विधियों का विरोध किया। उन्होंने सभी संप्रदायों की खुले तौर पर आलोचना की और मानव अस्तित्व के विभिन्न पहलुओं पर अपने सीधे आगे के दृष्टिकोण के साथ भारतीय दर्शन को एक नई दिशा दी। उन्होंने सभी अंधविश्वासों की व्यर्थता को उजागर किया, सब कुछ जिसे अलौकिक कहा जा सकता है और वह सब कुछ जो सिद्धांत रूप में असत्यापित है। गौरतलब है कि कबीर किसी धर्म के खिलाफ नहीं बल्कि धर्म के नाम पर लोगों द्वारा किए जा रहे पाखंड के खिलाफ प्रचार कर रहे थे। इस प्रकार, उन्होंने विभिन्न जातियों और धार्मिक संप्रदायों के बीच की खाई को पाटने का प्रयास किया। यही कारण है कि कबीर को पूरी दुनिया में बहुत सम्मान दिया जाता है।

किंवदंतियों के अनुसार, उनका जन्म 1398 ईस्वी में हुआ था। कहा जाता है कि बनारस के एक तालाब में एक मुस्लिम बुनकर को कमल के पत्ते पर तैरते हुए पाया गया था। बुनकर ने बच्चे को अपने अधीन कर लिया और पारंपरिक तरीके से उसे 'कबीर' नाम दिया, जिसका अर्थ है 'महान'। कबीर ने छोटी सी उम्र में ही अपार आध्यात्मिक प्रतिभा का परिचय दिया था। परंपरा हमें बताती है कि स्वामी रामानंद उनके गुरु (एक शिक्षक) थे।

क्या कबीर एक भारतीय कवि हैं?

कबीर, (अरबी: "महान") (जन्म 1440, वाराणसी, जौनपुर, भारत—मृत्यु 1518, मगहर), हिंदू, मुस्लिम और सिखों द्वारा प्रतिष्ठित भारतीय किव-संत। कबीर का जन्म रहस्य और किंवदंती में डूबा हुआ है। एक परंपरा यह मानती है कि उनका जन्म 1398 में हुआ था, जो उनकी मृत्यु पर उन्हें 120 वर्ष का बना देता। कबीर ने जोर देकर कहा कि भिक्त के माध्यम से ही ईश्वर को प्राप्त करने का एकमात्र तरीका है। गहन प्रेम और भिक्त निश्चित रूप से व्यक्ति को ईश्वरत्व की परम प्राप्ति की ओर ले जाती है। उनके चरणों में पूर्ण समर्पण व्यक्ति को उस तक पहुंचने में मदद करता है और यही सभी का अंतिम लक्ष्य होना चाहिए जिस पर कबीर ने जोर दिया था। वेदों में विर्णित विधि के अनुसार, परमात्मा कबीर साहेब, एक प्रकाश के एक तत्व (तेजपुंज) के शरीर में, सतलोक से आए और काशी, वाराणसी, भारत में लहरतर झील में एक कमल के फूल पर उतरे।

संत कबीर दास को उत्तरी भारत में भिक्त और सूफी आंदोलन का सबसे प्रभावशाली और सबसे उल्लेखनीय किव माना जाता है। कबीर नाम अरबी अल-कबीर से आया है जिसका अर्थ है 'महान' - कुरान में भगवान का 37 वां नाम और दास का अर्थ संस्कृत में दास या दास है। वह 14वीं शताब्दी के अंत और 15वीं शताब्दी की शुरुआत में जीवित रहे। कबीर का जन्म रहस्य और किंवदंती में डूबा हुआ है। अधिकारी दोनों पर असहमत हैं कि वह कब पैदा हुआ था और उसके माता-पिता कौन थे। एक किंवदंती के अनुसार, उनकी मां एक ब्राह्मण थीं, जो एक हिंदू मंदिर की यात्रा के बाद गर्भवती हो गई। चूंकि वह अविवाहित थी, उसने कबीर को त्याग दिया, जिसे नीरू नाम के एक मुस्लिम बुनकर ने

पाया और अपनाया। बड़े होने पर वे रामानंद स्वामी के शिष्य बन गए। कबीर का जीवन काशी के आसपास केंद्रित था, जिसे बनारस (वाराणसी) भी कहा जाता है, हमारे देश को आशीर्वाद देने वाले कई संतों में, कबीर दास, प्रसिद्ध रहस्यवादी किव, सामाजिक और धार्मिक क्रांति लाने के लिए एक प्रमुख श्रेय के पात्र हैं। वह सिद्धांतों के व्यक्ति थे और उन्होंने जो उपदेश दिया उसका अभ्यास किया। लोग उन्हें दास, संत, भक्त आदि विभिन्न नामों से पुकारते थे। दास के रूप में, उन्हें मानवता का सेवक और इस प्रकार देवत्व का सेवक कहा जाता था।

कबीर का मतलब?

कबीर एक मुस्लिम लड़के का नाम है। कबीर नाम का मतलब महान, बड़ा, विरष्ठ होता है। इसके कई इस्लामी अर्थ हैं। नाम की उत्पत्ति अरबी से हुई है। कबीर नाम का शुभ अंक क्या हो सकता है? कबीर की उक्ति में शिक्षक या 'गुरु' को प्रमुख स्थान दिया गया है। उनके अनुसार शिक्षक भगवान के अवतार थे। कबीर को यह अहसास तब हुआ जब वे रामानंद के संपर्क में आए। कबीर एक निराकार सर्वोच्च ईश्वर में विश्वास करते थे और उपदेश देते थे कि मोक्ष का एकमात्र मार्ग भिक्त या भिक्त है। उन्होंने अपने अनुयायियों को हिंदुओं और मुसलमानों दोनों में से आकर्षित किया। उनकी शिक्षाएं जीवन के धर्मनिरपेक्ष मुल्यों को दर्शाती हैं।

किव और रहस्यवादी कबीर भारत में 1440 और 1518 के बीच रहे और उनका भारतीय समाज पर और उसके बाद से बहुत प्रभाव पड़ा है। वह एक गहन आध्यात्मिक व्यक्ति थे, जिन्होंने हिंदू धर्म और इस्लाम दोनों की अवधारणाओं को एक विश्व दृष्टिकोण प्रस्तुत करने के लिए लिया, जो ब्रह्मांड में मनुष्य के स्थान को उसके सरलतम घटकों तक कम कर देता है। उनकी किवता सादगी के इस कुएं से पोषित होती है और कई सौ वर्षों तक, जीवन के सभी क्षेत्रों से भारतीय जनता के बीच उनकी स्थायी अपील का कारण बनी है। उनका अपना जीवन रहस्य और किंवदंती में डूबा हुआ है। उनके जन्म के बारे में यह कहा गया है कि वे या तो ब्राह्मण विधवा के पुत्र थे या वे कुंवारी जन्म से आए थे। हम जो जानते हैं वह यह है कि कबीर कभी औपचारिक रूप से शिक्षित नहीं हुए और अनपढ़ हुए, किसी ऐसे व्यक्ति के लिए एक आश्चर्यजनक तथ्य जिसने आज तक भारतीय मानस और किवता की दुनिया पर इतना प्रभाव डाला है। जन्म से ही मुस्लिम होने के बावजूद वे अपने जीवन के प्रारंभिक दिनों में हिंदू तपस्वी रामानंद के शिष्य बन गए।

कबीर के तीन मुख्य उपदेश?

कबीर द्वारा व्यक्त किए गए प्रमुख विचारों में शामिल हैं:

- प्रमुख धार्मिक परंपराओं की अस्वीकृति।
- ब्राह्मणवादी हिंदू धर्म और इस्लाम दोनों की बाहरी पूजा के सभी रूपों की आलोचना।
- पुरोहित वर्ग और जाति व्यवस्था की आलोचना।

- एक निराकार सर्वोच्च ईश्वर में विश्वास।
- मोक्ष प्राप्त करने के लिए भक्ति या भक्ति पर जोर।

कबीर पाखंड के सख्त खिलाफ थे और लोगों को दोहरा मापदंड बनाए रखना पसंद नहीं करते थे। उन्होंने हमेशा लोगों को अन्य जीवित प्राणियों के प्रति दयालु होने और सच्चे प्रेम का अभ्यास करने का उपदेश दिया। उन्होंने अच्छे लोगों की कंपनी की आवश्यकता का आग्रह किया जो मूल्यों और सिद्धांतों का पालन करते हैं उन्होंने न्यूनतम जीवन के विचार का समर्थन किया जिसकी सूफियों ने वकालत की थी। कबीर की कविता जीवन के बारे में उनके दर्शन का प्रतिबिंब है। उनका लेखन मुख्य रूप से पुनर्जन्म और कर्म की अवधारणा पर आधारित था। जीवन के बारे में कबीर का दर्शन बहुत स्पष्ट था। वह बहुत ही सरल तरीके से जीवन जीने में विश्वास करते थे। उन्होंने अपने लेखन में अपने मूल्यों और विश्वासों को बहुत खूबसूरती से व्यक्त किया है जिसमें दोहा, कविताएं, रमैनी, कहारवास और शब्द शामिल हैं। संत कबीर हिंदू समुदाय द्वारा थोपी गई जाति व्यवस्था के खिलाफ थे। उन्होंने कहा कि जाति के आधार पर कोई भेदभाव नहीं होना चाहिए, और वेद और कुरान दोनों के अधिकार को खारिज कर दिया। उन्होंने पुरुषों की समानता पर बहुत जोर दिया। उन्होंने इसे अपने सिखयों में से एक में खूबसूरती से व्यक्त किया है:

"ऊंचे कुल का जन्म, जे करनी उन ना होई, सुबारन कलास सुरा भरा, साधु निंदा सोई।"

उन्होंने प्रेम के धर्म का प्रचार किया जिसका उद्देश्य सभी जातियों और पंथों के बीच एकता को बढ़ावा देना था। वह मूर्ति पूजा में भी विश्वास नहीं रखते थे। इसके विपरीत, उन्होंने आत्मा की वेदांतिक अवधारणाओं की वकालत की। वह अनुष्ठानों और अंधविश्वासों के प्रदर्शन या तथाकथित पवित्र स्थानों की तीर्थयात्रा के भी खिलाफ थे। वह कहता है।

> मौको कह धुंधे बंदे, में तो तेरे पास में न में देवल न में मस्जिद, न कबे कैलास मे ना तो कौन क्रिया कर्म में, नहीं योग बैराग में खोज होई तो तुरते मिल्हो, पल भर की तलाश में कहे कबीर सुनो भाई साधो, सब स्वसो की स्वैस में"।

ऐसा माना जाता है कि कबीर ने 1399 से 1495 तक की अवधि में जिया और काम किया। यह भारतीय उपमहाद्वीप में बड़ी उथल-पुथल का दौर था। लोग पहले से ही नाथ, बौद्ध, योगी, शैव, शाक्त, वैष्णव, आदि जैसे विभिन्न धर्मों के प्रभाव में थे, जबकि इस्लाम और सूफीवाद ने भी जमीन हासिल की थी। इनमें से राज्य सत्ता इस्लाम के आधिपत्य

में थी। विभिन्न धर्मों के पैरोकारों के बीच भयंकर संघर्ष था और प्रत्येक व्यक्ति अपने विशेष धर्म के प्रभाव को जनता पर फैलाने में व्यस्त था। यह संघर्ष एक ओर एकीकरण की प्रक्रिया को जन्म दे रहा था, वहीं दूसरी ओर धर्म की एक शुद्ध और कर्मकांडी प्रक्रिया के विकास की ओर ले जा रहा था। प्रत्येक धर्म अपने स्वयं के विशिष्ट अनुष्ठानों को बढ़ावा दे रहा था और यह एकीकरण प्रक्रिया में बाधा बन रहा था। कबीर ने इन कर्मकांडों को निशाना बनाया और इस प्रक्रिया में उन्होंने किसी भी धर्म के कर्मकांडों को नहीं बख्शा।

कबीर नम्रता से भरे हुए थे और हिंदू धर्म और इस्लाम में मेल-मिलाप करने वाले पहले संत थे। उन्होंने ईमानदारी से उन गुणों का प्रचार करके इस्लाम और हिंदू धर्म की एकता पर जोर देने की कोशिश की जो दोनों धर्मों के लिए समान थे। उन्होंने हिन्दू-मुसलमान में कोई भेद नहीं किया। कबीर के लिए, अल्लाह और राम एक ही सर्वोच्च व्यक्ति के अलग-अलग नाम थे। उनके लिए हिंदू और मुसलमान "एक ही मिट्टी के बर्तन" थे। ईश्वर की एकता की अवधारणा में उनका दृढ़ विश्वास था। उन्होंने कोई बोले राम राम कोई खुदाई की धारणा की वकालत की। मूल विचार यह संदेश फैलाना था कि चाहे आप हिंदू भगवान या मुस्लिम भगवान का नाम जपें, तथ्य यह है कि केवल एक ही भगवान है जो निर्माता है यह खूबसूरत दुनिया।

कबीर की सामाजिक नैतिकता

यह एक सर्वविदित तथ्य है कि स्वस्थ व्यक्ति स्वस्थ समाज का निर्माण करते हैं और स्वस्थ समाज स्वस्थ व्यक्तियों का निर्माण कर सकता है। इस बात को ध्यान में रखते हुए, मध्यकालीन भक्तों ने हमेशा व्यक्तिगत नैतिकता के रूप में विशिष्ट सिफारिशें की हैं जो बड़े पैमाने पर मानव समाज के लिए परोपकारी और लाभकारी हो सकती हैं। इस मोड़ पर, यह इंगित करने योग्य है कि मध्यकालीन किव बार-बार जीवन के महान गुणों जैसे शुद्धता, इच्छा रहित कर्म, विश्वास आदि पर जोर देते हैं। कबीर सभी को इस तथ्य से अवगत कराते हैं कि मानव जन्म दुर्लभ से दुर्लभ है इसलिए कबीर नेक काम पर जोर देते हैं और हर एक को उसके चरित्र में सकारात्मकता के बारे में पूछते हैं, जिससे प्रत्येक व्यक्ति को धन या सांसारिक धन के लिए तरसने के लिए नैतिक दिशानिर्देश स्थापित नहीं होता है। यह इंगित कर सकता है कि कबीर हर किसी को सांसारिक धन के लिए अपनी व्यक्तिगत भूख और अतृम इच्छा / लालसा का खंडन करने के लिए कहता है तािक इस दुनिया को एक बेहतर और शांतिपूर्ण रहने का स्थान बनाया जा सके। कबीर का विचार कुछ हद तक प्राचीन भारतीय साहित्य द्वारा प्रचारित विचारों के समान है, यह कहा जाना चाहिए कि उक्त काल के किव इस तथ्य के प्रति बहुत सचेत हैं कि स्थायी सुख का मार्ग इंद्रियों के मार्ग और उनके जीवन के उद्देश्य में नहीं है। सच्चे आंतरिक स्व का एहसास करना है। कबीर, अपने प्रयास में सफलता प्राप्त करने के लिए, भौतिक सुखों की निंदा करते हैं और उनके वास्तविक आंतरिक-स्व पर ध्यान केंद्रित करने का प्रयास करते हैं, जिसे कबीर परमात्मा का एक अंश मानते हैं। शार्लोट वाडेविल का मत है कि कबीर और भक्ति आंदोलन के अन्य संतों का दर्शन निर्पक्ष की तलाश है। इस निर्पक्ष की धारणा

कबीर की निर्गुण है, ब्रह्म-आत्मान की उपनिषद अवधारणा और वेदांतिक परंपरा की अद्वैतवादी व्याख्या के अनुसार है जो आत्मा और ईश्वर के बीच किसी भी प्रकार के भेद को नकारती है, और मनुष्य से वास्तविक सार को पहचानने का आग्रह करती है। स्वयं जो वास्तविक दिव्य प्रकृति का है। यह इंगित किया जाना चाहिए कि कबीर जैसे कई अन्य संत कबीर के रूप में एक ही अवधारणा को दबा रहे हैं और इस विशेष प्रक्रिया के अनुसार "ईश्वर में विलय, या एकता" की अवधारणा के बजाय "ईश्वर के साथ मिलन" कहा जा सकता है। सभी प्राणियों में"

कबीर, आश्चर्यजनक रूप से, अपनी आध्यात्मिक प्रगति के बारे में बहुत सचेत हैं, जब वे दर्शकों को जागरूक करते हैं और उन्हें नेक आचरण वाला व्यक्ति बनने के लिए मार्गदर्शन करते हैं। कबीर भी माया की शक्ति से वाकिफ हैं और इसे माया की संज्ञा देते हैं और सभी को इस माया से अवगत होने के लिए कहते हैं जो सभी को मानवता के नेक मार्ग से विचलित कर देती है। वह समझता है कि लालच, घृणा और भ्रम से प्रेरित कार्यों में उन लोगों को वास्तविकता से दूर करने की प्रवृत्ति होती है जो उनका अनुसरण करते हैं [13]। बेहतर प्रेरणा के साथ किए गए कार्य, लेकिन फिर भी स्वयं की भावना से प्रभावित होकर, पुनर्जन्म उत्पन्न करते हैं। इस चक्र में बड़ी संख्या में संवेदनशील प्राणी फंस गए हैं, लगातार एक क्षेत्र से दूसरे क्षेत्र में भटक रहे हैं, बचने में असमर्थ हैं और प्रत्येक क्षेत्र में मौजूद दुख के रूपों का अनुभव करने के लिए मजबूर हैं। कबीर प्राचीन भारतीय ज्ञान द्वारा प्रचारित क्रिया के इसी रहस्य को समझते हैं और इसी तथ्य से सभी को अवगत कराते हैं। उसके लिए, मानव क्षेत्र विशेष रूप से भाग्यशाली है, क्योंकि यह पूरे ब्रह्मांड में एकमात्र एकल दहलीज है जो सभी को आत्म-मुक्ति के मार्ग पर ले जा सकती है। इसलिए कबीर सभी को अपनी इंद्रियों को सकारात्मक दिशा में नियंत्रित करने के लिए कहते हैं ताकि इस धरती को रहने के लिए एक बेहतर जगह बनाया जा सके। वह समझता है कि मानव मन ही काम, लोभ और इसी तरह हर बुराई का मूल कारण है। इस प्रकार, वह अपने मन को सकारात्मक अर्थों में नियंत्रित करने में विश्वास करता है और वह इसे सकारात्मक दिशा में नियंत्रित करता है और इस प्रकार एक हंसमुख जीवन जीने में सक्षम होता है। वह इस तथ्य से अवगत है कि उनके आनंदमय अस्तित्व का अर्थ सभी चेतन और निर्जीव प्राणियों के सहयोग में निहित है, न कि निर्मम प्रतिस्पर्धा में। हम कठौपनीश में यम निचकेता संवादों के संदर्भ में आ सकते हैं, जहां यम यह कहकर कार्रवाई के सिद्धांत को स्पष्ट करते हैं "अज्ञान के बीच में रहते हुए और खुद को बुद्धिमान और प्रबुद्ध समझकर, मूर्ख लोग कुटिल मार्गों का पालन करते हुए, चक्कर लगाते हैं, जैसे अंधे के नेतृत्व में अंधा "(कठोउपनिषद1.ii.5)। वह शायद समझता है कि जीवन में सामंजस्य के लिए कई विकल्प हैं और इस प्रकार वह सही और गलत के बीच भेदभाव करने के लिए कहता है। हो सकता है क्योंकि ज्ञान और अज्ञान व्यापक रूप से अलग हैं और उनके अलग-अलग पाठ्यक्रम हैं।

कबीर शायद यह भी समझते हैं कि दूसरे संसार की प्राप्ति के साधन उस अविवेकी व्यक्ति के सामने प्रकट नहीं होते हैं, जो धन के लालच में मूर्खता करता है (कठोउपनिषद1.ii.6)। इस प्रकार वह सभी को धर्मी आचरण करने के लिए कहता है / उच्च आचरण के रूप में व्यवहार मिट्टी के धन वाले व्यक्ति की तुलना में कहीं अधिक महत्वपूर्ण है।

उसके लिए मन की शांति आचरण में प्रथम स्थान रखती है। उनका मत है कि जो व्यक्ति धर्म के मार्ग पर चलता है उसके लिए धन और धन व्यर्थ हो जाता है। यह कबीर द्वारा प्रचारित मार्ग के लिए उचित होगा, आत्म-साक्षात्कार की एक प्रक्रिया है, बनने की एक प्रक्रिया है जिसमें आत्म-मुक्ति के लिए जीवन के इन मूल गुणों के माध्यम से खुद को ऊपर उठाना पड़ता है और यह केवल इसके द्वारा किया जा सकता है जीवन के इन महान गुणों को अपनाने का मतलब।

कबीर की शायरी

कबीर के दर्शन की सामाजिक और व्यावहारिक अभिव्यक्ति युगों से चली आ रही है। यह हिंदू और मुस्लिम अवधारणाओं के संश्लेषण का प्रतिनिधित्व करता है। वह हिंदू धर्म से पुनर्जन्म की अवधारणा और कर्म के नियम को स्वीकार करता है। इस्लाम से वह एकल ईश्वर की पृष्टि और जाति व्यवस्था और मूर्तिपूजा की अस्वीकृति लेता है। वे जिन बुनियादी धार्मिक सिद्धांतों का समर्थन करते हैं, वे सरल हैं। कबीर के अनुसार, सारा जीवन दो आध्यात्मिक सिद्धांतों की परस्पर क्रिया है। एक व्यक्तिगत आत्मा (जीवात्मा) है और दूसरी ईश्वर (परमात्मा) है। कबीर का विचार है कि मोक्ष इन दो दैवीय सिद्धांतों को मिलाने की प्रक्रिया है। कबीर भारतीय इतिहास में एक बहुत ही महत्वपूर्ण व्यक्ति हैं। वह इस मायने में असामान्य है कि वह हिंदुओं, सिखों और मुसलमानों के लिए समान रूप से आध्यात्मिक रूप से महत्वपूर्ण है। कबीर ने खुले तौर पर सभी संप्रदायों की आलोचना की और भारतीय दर्शन को एक नई दिशा दी। कबीर आत्मा, अंतरात्मा, जागरूकता की भावना और अस्तित्व की जीवन शक्ति को इस तरह से छूते हैं जो सादगी और शैली दोनों में अतुलनीय है। यही कारण है कि कबीर को पूरे विश्व में उच्च सम्मान में रखा जाता है। कबीर की कविता की एक और खूबी यह है कि वह हमारे दैनिक जीवन को घेरने वाली स्थितियों को उठाते हैं। इस प्रकार कबीर का काव्य आज भी सामाजिक और आध्यात्मिक दोनों सन्दर्भों में प्रासंगिक और सहायक है। कबीर का अनुसरण करने का अर्थ है अपने अंतरात्मा को समझना, स्वयं को महसूस करना, स्वयं को जैसा है वैसा स्वीकार करना और अपने परिवेश के साथ सामंजस्य स्थापित करना। कबीर ने बहुत कविता और गीत लिखे हैं। कबीर के सभी रिकॉर्ड किए गए छंद हिंदी में हैं। उनके गीतों को स्थानीय भाषा के मुक्त उपयोग की विशेषता है, और उनके दिन के व्याकरणिक बंधनों से मुक्त है। यह वह गुण है जिसने भारतीयों की पीढ़ियों के लिए उनके दर्शन को सुलभ बनाया है।

कबीर ने अपने लेखन के माध्यम से एक शिक्षक और समाज सुधारक की भूमिका निभाई, जिसमें मुख्य रूप से दोहस नामक दो पंक्ति छंद शामिल थे। वेदांत, सूफीवाद, वैष्णववाद और नाथ संप्रदाय में उनका दृढ़ विश्वास था। उन्होंने अपने जीवन के विभिन्न अनुभवों के माध्यम से प्राप्त ज्ञान को लागू किया। वह हमेशा सत्य की खोज में रहता था और कोई भी उसे रोक नहीं सकता था। कबीर अपने धार्मिक जुड़ाव के लिए जाने जाते थे। अपनी पुस्तक 'ए वीवर नेम्ड कबीर' के परिचय में, चार्लोट वाडेविल ने ठीक ही कहा, "कबीर भारतीय परंपरा में सबसे प्रसिद्ध और सबसे सम्मानित नामों में से एक है। पंजाब से लेकर बंगाल तक और हिमालय की सीमा से लेकर दक्षिण भारत तक, लंबे समय से हिंदुओं और

मुसलमानों द्वारा एक महान रहस्यवादी और साहसी धार्मिक सुधारक के रूप में उनका स्वागत किया गया है। कबीर की एक और विशेषता यह है कि उन्होंने स्वयं के श्रम से कमाई पर बहुत जोर दिया। अपने पूरे जीवन में, उन्होंने एक बुनकर के रूप में अपना काम कभी नहीं छोड़ा। वे मेहनतकशों के कट्टर समर्थक थे और जीवन भर जनता के संत बने रहे। भिक्त आंदोलन की एक महत्वपूर्ण विशेषता यह है कि इसके अधिकांश कार्यकर्ता समाज के मेहनतकश वर्गों, विशेषकर शिल्पकारों से थे। अधिकांश संत अछूत और पिछड़ी (दिलत) जातियों से थे। एक मायने में इसे मध्य युग के भारत के मेहनतकश जनसमुदाय द्वारा पुराने विचारों और पुराने सत्ता ढांचे के खिलाफ एक वैचारिक-दार्शनिक विरोध के रूप में समझा जा सकता है। मेहनतकश जनता का जीवन के प्रति समाज के उच्च वर्गों से बिल्कुल अलग दृष्टिकोण था। उन्होंने आत्मा और ईश्वर की एकता, मनुष्य की एकता और समानता की बात की। उन्होंने सौहार्दपूर्ण सह-अस्तित्व और सुख-दुख के बंटवारे की बात की। दिखावा, दिखावा, कर्मकांड, इन सबका उनके लिए कोई मतलब नहीं था। कबीर ने जीवन के संघर्ष से भागकर साधु (संन्यासी) बनने की बात कभी नहीं की।

कबीर दास, कवि, गायक और संस्थापक

भारतीय संस्कृति और साहित्य में सबसे महान नामों में से एक कबीर दास द्वारा छोड़े गए जन्म, जन्म स्थान, जीवन, मृत्यु और कार्यों के बारे में विद्वानों के अलग-अलग मत हैं। वह किव, गायक और संत धर्म के संस्थापक थे, और 'कबीर' शब्द 'एक महान व्यक्ति' को दर्शाता है। यह धर्म इस्लाम और हिंदू धर्म के सिद्धांतों का एक संयोजन था, जिसे उन्होंने इस्लाम-हिंदू मित्रता और सभी पुरुषों के भाईचारे के लिए उपयोग करने का प्रयास किया; और अंधिविश्वासों और अनुचित प्रथाओं का विरोध करने के लिए भी। कबीर काशी में रहते थे, (बनारस) भारत में हिंदू तीर्थयात्रा का सबसे प्रसिद्ध केंद्र। 14वीं शताब्दी में और उनके कार्यों ने हिंदी साहित्य में भित्त आंदोलन के रूप में जाना जाता है। कबीर की कोई औपचारिक शिक्षा नहीं थी। मैंने स्याही या कागज को छुआ नहीं है, न ही मैंने कलम पकड़ी है, वह अपने दोहे में कहता है। वह एक बुनकर था, और वह अपने कुछ कार्यों में खुद को ऐसा कहता है। उसने अपने माता-पिता को खो दिया - कुछ लोग कहते हैं कि उसकी माँ एक ब्राह्मण विधवा थी - जीवन में ही। किंवदंतियाँ हैं कि उनका पालन-पोषण गैर-हिंदुओं द्वारा किया गया था। वह अपनी किवताओं में दावा करता है कि वह न तो हिंदू है और न ही मुसलमान। रूढ़िवादी अंधिवश्वासों और मूर्खतापूर्ण रीति-रिवाजों की उनकी स्पष्ट आंलोचना ने उनके लिए बड़ी संख्या में शत्रुओं को अर्जित किया। कबीर का पहला उल्लेख भक्तमाला (1500 ई.) में मिलता है, जिसमें उनके प्रारंभिक जीवन के बारे में कुछ बहुमूल्य जानकारी उपलब्ध है। सिख धर्म के पवित्र ग्रंथ ग्रेंडा साहिब में भी कबीर का उल्लेख है और उनकी कुछ किवताओं का भी उल्लेख है

कबीर की कविताएँ, हालांकि सरल शब्दों में, शक्तिशाली विचार से गर्भवती थीं, और प्रभाव अनूठा था। वे चतुर्भुज भगवान की पूजा करते हैं, लेकिन मैं कई भुजाओं वाले भगवान की पूजा करता हूं - उन्होंने अपनी एक कविता

में कहा। एक अन्य कविता में उन्होंने पूछा - तुर्कों की मस्जिदें हैं और हिंदुओं के मंदिर हैं; लेकिन जहां मस्जिद और मंदिर नहीं हैं, वहां सत्ता का मालिक कौन है? एक और कविता मासूमियत से घोषणा करती है - गंगा में डुबकी लगाने से सांसारिक जीवन से मुक्ति मिलती है, तो नीच मेंढक को दिन में कई बार यह मुक्ति मिलनी चाहिए थी! कबीर के भगवान न मूर्ति में थे, न मन्दिरों में, न मस्जिदों में; लेकिन यह परम ज्ञान है। इसका कोई आकार नहीं है, और कोई चेहरा नहीं है, यहां तक कि प्रतीकात्मक रूप भी नहीं है; लेकिन यह एक फूल की सुगंध की तरह है, यह बाएं या वाएं या ऊपर या नीचे नहीं है, लेकिन यह परम आनंद का सर्वोत्कृष्ट सार है - वह घोषणा करता है। उन्होंने आम बोलियों के मिश्रण में लिखा, जिसमें कोई भी हिंदू, उर्दू, फारसी शब्द और भोजपुरी, पंजाबी और मारवाड़ी जैसी बोलियों में इस्तेमाल होने वाले शब्दों और भावों को पा सकता है। भारत के उत्तर पश्चिम के ग्रामीण पीढ़ी दर पीढ़ी उनकी कविताओं का जश्न मनाते हैं।

उनकी रचनाएँ सिख धर्मग्रंथ, गुरु ग्रंथ साहिब में भी अंकित हैं। पिवत्र गुरु ग्रंथ साहिब में कबीर के 500 से अधिक श्लोक हैं। विशेष रूप से सिख समुदाय और अन्य जो पिवत्र ग्रंथ का पालन करते हैं, कबीर को अन्य दस गुरुओं के समान सम्मान में रखते हैं। इसलिए कुछ विद्वान उन्हें सिख धर्म का अग्रदूत बताते हैं। कुछ ने तो उन्हें गुरु नानक का गुरु भी कहा है। संक्षेप में, भारतीय धार्मिक इतिहास में, कबीर अद्वितीय हैं, हिंदुओं के लिए, वे वैष्णव भक्त हैं, मुस्लिम के लिए, पीर, सिख के लिए, भगत, जैनियों के लिए, आचार्य या मुनि, सांप्रदायिक कबीर पंथियों के लिए। आधुनिक देशभक्तों के लिए, सर्वोच्च होने के एक अवतार, कबीर हिंदू और मुस्लिम एकता के चैंपियन हैं, नए वेदांतियों के लिए सार्वभौमिक धर्म या मनुष्य के धर्म के प्रवर्तक हैं।

कबीर की व्यक्तिगत नैतिकता

सबसे पहले यह स्पष्ट कर दिया जाए कि कबीर निराकार रूप में सर्वोच्च शक्ति के प्रशंसक हैं और इस प्रकार, वह शक्ति सर्वोच्च के नाम पर किए जा रहे निरर्थक अनुष्ठानों की वैधता और उपयोगिता को निडर तरीके से पूछते हैं। उनके प्रश्न सरल हैं फिर भी उनमें बोध की गहराई है। उसके लिए, केवल एक ही नियंत्रण शक्ति है। विचार यद्यपि उपनिषदों से लिया गया है, फिर भी विचार की अभिव्यक्ति का एक अलग तरीका है। उदाहरण के लिए, कबीर, शक्ति को सर्वोच्च मानते हैं और हमें एक महान बरगद के पेड़ की उपमा प्रदान करते हैं जो उल्टा है। इसे उद्धृत करने के पीछे विचार यह है कि कबीर ने सभी मनुष्यों में एकरूपता का अनुभव करने का प्रयास किया। कबीर ने अपने चारणों के माध्यम से ईश्वर की एकता की अवधारणा पर जोर दिया है जिसे केवल भक्ति के माध्यम से प्राप्त किया जा सकता है। वह सांप्रदायिक प्रथाओं और धर्मों के बीच भेदभाव नहीं करता है। उसके लिए, सभी को दिव्य कृपा प्राप्त करने का समान अधिकार है। कबीर अपनी कृपा पाने के लिए श्रेष्ठ जाति, वीरता, समय को महत्वहीन समझते हैं। उनके अनुसार सर्वोच्च शक्ति को प्राप्त करने का मार्ग। पूर्ण समर्पण के साथ पूर्ण धार्मिक आचरण में निहित है और किसी भी प्रकार के कर्मकांड में नहीं। इस प्रकार, वह सर्वोच्च शक्ति के नाम पर किए जा रहे अनुष्ठानों और बलिदानों की निंदा करता है। उदाहरण के लिए, कबीर न केवल

ईश्वर के नाम पर सभी के द्वारा किए जा रहे निरर्थक अभ्यासों पर अपनी व्यक्तिगत अटकलें और संदेह पैदा करते हैं, बिना कोई दूसरा विचार किए या दिमाग पर अंकुश लगाए। उनके लिए, भिक्त का अर्थ जीवन के बिल्ली के बच्चे के सिद्धांत की तरह सर्वोच्च शक्ति के प्रति पूर्ण समर्पण है। इसे प्राप्त करने के लिए वे करुणामयी रूप से अपनी कविता के माध्यम से सार्वभौमिक प्रेम की बात करते हैं। उसके लिए, संपूर्ण मानवता के बीच भेदभाव पाप की ओर ले जाता है। कबीर का प्राय: मत है कि जब सत्ता परमात्मा ने एक ही महान मानव पंथ की रचना की है, तो ऐसी स्थिति में जातियों में भेद करना व्यर्थ है। यही कारण है कि वह न केवल ब्राह्मणत्व की प्रामाणिकता को चुनौती देता है बिल्क इसके बारे में अपने कुछ संदेह भी उठाता है। आखिरकार, वह जाति, रंग और पंथ के नाम पर किए जा रहे भेदभाव के खिलाफ है।

यह उल्लेख करने के लिए संदर्भ से बाहर नहीं हो सकता है कि उनकी भिक्त सर्वोच्च शिक्त के लिए वंदना और श्रद्धा की सार्वभौमिक अपील से शुरू होती है, जो स्वयं की परम चेतना है और हर एक, उनके लिए, सर्वोच्च शिक्त और आंतरिक चेतना एक समान है चीज़। कबीर हर जगह परम शिक्त का अनुभव करने में सक्षम हैं। कबीर पूजा स्थलों पर नहीं जाते क्योंकि उनके लिए यह अनिवार्य नहीं है। न तो कबीर पक्ष लेते हैं और न ही कोई कर्मकांड करते हैं। कबीर समझते हैं कि मन और वाणी के माध्यम से किए गए अच्छे कर्मों का सार सर्वोच्च शिक्त के लिए वंदना और श्रद्धा है क्योंकि कबीर समझते हैं कि बिना किसी समझ के किए गए अनुष्ठान हमेशा के लिए आनंदमय अस्तित्व का मार्ग प्रशस्त नहीं करते हैं

The manipulation was on the basis of education, languages, culture, caste and race. It is Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar who makes the radiant change in the society by bringing subaltern consciousness.

Analysis:

Ambedkar traces the genesis of the oppressive nature of the caste dominated Indian society to the so called sacred Shastras of the Hindus who guarded them so closely that if anyone except them read or hear them he would commit any act of sacrilege. He realizes that caste and Brahminic Hinduism reinforce each other and discriminate against the downtrodden sections of the society. Indian religious texts subjugated Dalits and reduced by their domineering conquerors to inhuman state. Rig Veda is one of the hegemonic religious scriptures which enshrines the version of Purusha Suktas hymns which mentioned the four basic varnas. (The Philosophy of Hinduism, p. 80).

Manusmriti sanctioned plainest for such a sacrilegious act. According to Ambedkar, the ancient scriptures like Vedas, Smritis and Shastras were all instrument of torture used by Hinduism against the untouchables. In fact, it was Ambedkar's subaltern perspective, which pierced through the Shastra's to reveal their true face. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar puts forward Manusmriti before us and its heinous statement against untouchables. Through this book, he points out the baseless of hierarchy of social structure that is Brahmin, Kshatriya, Vaishya and Shudra. Ambedkar protests against the orthodox system of Manu and exposes his view in fierce, "This system of rank and gradation is, simply another way of enunciating the principle of inequality so that it may be truly said that Hinduism does not recognise equality." (Philosophy of Hinduism, p. 25)

According to him, this book is the instrument of torture proposed by Hinduism against untouchables. Indeed, it was Ambedkar's subaltern approach which pierced through the Shastras to reveal their true face. The *Manusmriti* is not only derogatory remark against the untouchables rather imposed several social religious restrictions upon them. It sanctioned austere castigation for such a disrespectful act. *Manusmriti* was written in the Sanskrit language and only few people can used to understand the same. The content of this book was unfamiliar those who are untouchables. The most essential thing is various religious and social

restrictions imposed on Shudras. Dr. Ambedkar puts forward the rigid rules of Manu regarding marriage. He proposes that Manu opposes the intermarriage outside the defined class. He says, "Manu was most anxious to preserve the rule of inequality which was his guiding principle." (Philosophy of Hinduism, pp. 26-27). Babasaheb officially destroyed the authority of Manusmriti by drafting the Indian Constitution that established rights of Dalits and women as human rights.

The Mahabharata exemplified the degraded status of the outcastes like Ekalavya. He proposes that Bhagwad Gita is dogmatic scripture, having unbending, inflexible, rigid doctrines. He recommends Buddha's preaching of non-violence and his offensive similes against the theories of Chaturvarnya is

counter narration to Bhagawad Gita. (Krishna and his Gita, p. 363)

Ambedkar made the subversion of Ancient Indian history. His narrative version is alternative and counter narrative to Vedic, Puranic views of Indian culture and history. His seminal book Who were the Shudras? traces back the racial history of Shudras in India. Dr. Ambedkar officially demolishes the authority of Vedic traditional views about social structure. Dr. Ambedkar's rejected the superiority of Aryan theory of the subaltern. He says, "Aryan Samajists have done great mischief in making the Hindu society a stationary society by preaching that Vedas are eternal... infallible." (Who Were the Shudras? p. xvii)

In his seminal book, The Buddha and His Dhamma, Ambedkar designates the quintessential issues which concerned him all through his life. He not only encouraged the wisdoms of Buddha but gave new understandings appropriate for the present context. His picture of Buddhism focused more on the social message of Buddha. He proposed Buddhism over other religions. The Buddhist teachings like Pradnya, Karuna and Samata gave energy to the oppressed and downtroddens. (The Buddha and His Dhamma, pp. 285-325). Buddhism emerged as an answer to the evils that existed in Brahminic society, Buddhism was the revolution against Brahminic society. Decline of Buddhism emerged as a result of the revival of Brahminism under the king Pushyamitra, with the help of Manusmirti this lead to the establishment of Hindu religion with its rigid caste system and suppression of women. Varna system was replaced by rigid caste system with strict division of labour and endogamy. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar showed an astonishing interest in Marxism in the 1950s. In his seminal bools, The Buddha and his Dhamma, Buddha and the Future of His Religion, and Buddha and Karl Marx, refer to Marx as the central figure. He acknowledged certain critical realm on which he agreed with Karl Marx: the task of philosophy is to transform the world; there is conflict between class and class; private possession of property causes regret and manipulation; and good society requires that private property be collectivized.

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar made the metamorphosis in the by approving Buddhist tradition which made the emancipation of Dalits. For Ambedkar Buddhism proposes a social rebuilding for abolishing suffering of the subjugated. Embracing Buddhism is not for its fighting nature, but as an ideological revolution, a counter culture and ethics. Ambedkarian philosophy aims at giving life to those who are underprivileged at elevating those who are repressed and ennobling those who are downtrodden and granting

liberty, equality and justice to all irrespective of caste, gender and creed.

He emphasized in his Annihilation of Caste that the Smirits and Shastras were not the embodiment of religion but a system of rules to deprive the untouchables even of their basic needs and deny them equal status in the society. Therefore, he said that there is no hesitation in saying that such a religion must be destroyed and there is nothing irreligious in working for the destruction of such a religion that discriminate against its own people whom it bracketed as untouchables. Dr. Ambedkar says, "It is not Buddha who weakened Hindu society by his gospel of non-violence. It is the Brahminic theory of Chaturvarnya that has been responsible not only for the defeat but for the decay of Hindu society." (Annihilation of Caste, p. 219). In Untouchables or the Children of the India's Ghetto, he contrasts it with other varieties of inequality which were not so difficult to abolish or correct. He figures out the source of untouchability in their diverse forms. He explores that slavery of untouchable is very institution of Hindus. It was systematized by Manu. According to Ambedkar, "untouchable is not the free social order. It was worse type of unfree social order. It was obligatory." (Untouchables or the Children of the India's Ghetto, p. 9)

Ambedkar's work Revolution and Counter Revolution in India is an alternative version of Indian history. It is a subversion of Ancient traditional history. This is necessary to unconventional to Vedic and Puranic clarification of Indian history. His book Revolution and Counter Revolution is a treatise to subaltern history. Indian history is written in the perspective of Brahminic or Vedic hierarchy of knowledge. Ambedkar's narrative supports the oppressed and marginalized. He reinterpreted the history for social

metamorphosis in favour of the Dalits and outcastes. This is complete demolition of the orthodox systems of ancient and medieval India. Ambedkar says that Buddhism is revolutionary to orthodox Hindu religion. It was not the religious revolution but also social and political revolution. This is a counter narration he wrote in his treatise. (Revolution and Counter Revolution, p. 153).

The suppression of lower caste is not a new issue of the world. Dominant social castes and elite class often looked to the subalterns in maligned and prejudiced way. The cultural manipulation of the dominant social castes on the underprivileged classes and Dalits was on the basis of education, languages, caste, and culture. It is Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar made the radiant metamorphosis in the society by bringing subaltern

Dr. Ambedkar dedicated his life for the uplifting Dalits. He was opposed to the theory of caste based superiority and social discrimination. He made a path for legal rights to enact the laws in connection with progress of Dalits which could positively change their lives. The outcastes are oppressed and exploited sections of the Indian society. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar wrote quintessential narrative works to evaluate the basic source of Indian caste system. His articles and writings contributed to figure out the problems, prospects and consequences of the caste, creed and religions.

Ambedkar's narration of history has a great potential in mediating both liberal and communitarian traditions of the west. He connects the individual and community based on morality. He designates the humanistic, reformative and rational religion that is Budhhist religion which is the source of ethics and associate living. When Ambedkar criticises Hindu community for its oppressive nature, he does it with a standard of individual liberty and freedom. When he is talking about suffering of individual members of Dalit community he is projecting an ideal moral community based on equality, liberty and fraternity. Another important part of Ambedkar's subaltern approach for the empowerment of Dalits and their liberation was his important construction of Indian nationalism. This was in opposition to the dominant discourse of orthodox Hinduism as represented by Bal Gangadhar Tilak, Raja Rammohan Roy, Mohandas Gandhi and Jawahrlal Nehru.

His conception of nationalism articulated and synthesized the national perceptions and aspirations of the downtrodden. Ambedkar's alternative form of nationalism, popularly known as 'Dalit-Bahujan Samaj', also incorporated the subaltern philosophy of Jyotirao Phule and Periyuar E.V. Ramaswami Naicker. His perspective protested against Hindus particularly Brahmins as anti-Hindu and anti-Brahminical discourse of Indian Nationalism. His epistemology of Dalit aimed at founding a casteless society in which no one can be manipulated and discriminated on the basis of birth, caste, creed, race, ethnicity and occupation. Ambedkar constructed a counterview of pre-colonial Brahminical society which was established on hierarchy. The dichotomy between privileged and underprivileged graded the caste system. This part of system is called a inegalitarianism which lead to the process of oppression by the orthodox Brahminical castes. Dr. Bahasaheb Ambedkar's subaltern perspective is counter-narrative to established and legitimized cultural and religious traditions.

Conclusion:

To conclude, it can be stated that both in his training and in his vision of life, Ambedkar was deeply aware of the larger dynamics of the world, its complexity and differential bearing on social groups, localities and nations. For Ambedkar, the vision of emancipating untouchables was clearly anchored in the principles of justice, equality, fraternity, and liberty. His approach to subaltern communities was pragmatic, realistic and sensible rather than naïve, unrealistic and impractical. What this essay has tried to do is to frame his wide-ranging and astute vision in and through the recurrent struggles of his life. In doing so, the paper has relied on the contribution to the subaltern societies and deprived classes. For the state to sustain a modicum of hegemony Ambedkar has become an indispensable necessity today.

Abstract---This research paper designs to show the quintessential importance of the rubrics in evaluation of the learners in the outcome based education. The paper attempts to communicate expectations of quality around a task. Rubrics is an evaluative criterion which can be used to measure expected levels of performance of the learners. Rubrics can make brilliant culmination in the traditional approach to assess learners. It is used to delineate consistent criteria for grading. Outcome based education is flourished with rubrics in evaluation system. Rubrics allows teachers and students alike to evaluate criteria which can be complex and subjective. Scoring rubrics can also provide a basis for self-evaluation, reflection and peer review. It aims at fair assessment, fostering understanding, motivating, indicating a way to proceed with subsequent learning. Rubrics can be classified as holistic, analytic or developmental. Holistic rubric integrates all aspects of the work into a single overall rating of the work. Learners can better be judged and revised by the teachers through rubrics in diverse kinds of evaluation. A rubric measure students work against real life criteria and is referred to as a form of authentic assessment. This research paper concentrates on the polemical interpretation of conventional methods used in the evaluation. Hence the methodology used in this paper is interpretation, analysis and description. In outcome based education rubrics in evaluation plays major role in evaluating the learners.

It can be used for class participation, marking assignments or overall grades. Rubrics can visually track progress patterns.

Broadly, rubrics underpin the requirements and expectations of how students need to approach their assessment to achieve their learning level. For educators, rubrics can improve making objectivity, consistency, and efficiency. It decrease queries from students about assessments. It also provides the foundation of feedback to the students. For students, rubrics can provide explicit criteria and standards. It can also provide clarity in expectations of what is required. Rubric also provides guidance in identifying the performance gap between their submitted work and the desired standard. It also assist students to develop understanding and making judgments about the quality of their work. Rubrics supports our feedback process. Regular feedback is the one of the most powerful method to enhance students' learning. Students need frequent opportunities to articulate what they know ad receive suggestions for improvement. Feedback that follow during learning can be active. This supports students in realizing their progress and respond to improve their achievements. Good feedback clarifies goal, expected standards that are aligned to the course learning outcomes and the assessment rubrics. Feedback can also enable the development of selfassessment through reflection. It also encourages teacher and student conversations about learning. It enables positive motivational beliefs and selfesteem. There are alternative methods on online platforms that are easier to conduct tests. One is multiple choice questions, match the following, multiples

responses, drag and drop, fill in the blanks, sequencing or ordering, one word for phrase, true or faults, select and numeric. There are many software to conduct examinations. But the problems is that how to evaluate the short answers and essays. There remains lot of subjective response of the teachers. The exactness of the observation of the students' assignment stumbles here. There are two easy methods without using online platforms. One is use of transformations and another is use of micro-fine rubrics. Transformation is alternative method. There is question like "Define Empathy. Illustrate with an example." If this question is asked to the graduate students, varied answers will come out of this question. The purpose of rubrics here is ensure our evaluation. The question can be transformed in many ways to make it more interesting rather than conventional. Rather a teacher can ask question by using online transformations. "Identify a news item from internet that you have seen recently which you feel empathetic about. Paste the link of the news item in the space below." Again a teacher can ask one more question by using online transformation: "What the situation was and what kind of empathy it was?" Here conventional question asked by replacing online transformations. It gives more choice and alternative to the learners. Here rubrics are best for assignments or projects that require evaluation on multiple dimensions.

It can be shared to determine the degree of consensus regarding what and how and why a certain process is being implemented. There are four basic and important steps in constructing the rubrics: 1] determining topic or task, 2] determining criteria for success, 3] learning outcomes of objectives and 4] describing assessment measure.

There are two types of rubrics: Holistic Rubrics and Analytic Rubrics. Holistic rubrics group several different assessment criteria and classify them together under grade heading or achievement levels. Whereas analytic rubrics separate different assessment criteria and address them comprehensively. In a horizontal assessment rubric, the top axis includes values that can be expressed either numerically or by letter grade or a scale from exceptional to poor or professional to poor. Rubrics should be uses as learning tool not always as an assessment tool. Rubrics always provide a comprehensive guide to the assessment. Grading policy is must not become the part of education. Targeting the student's outcome and measuring with some evidenced criteria is not rubric. This may results into good mathematics, but bad evaluation and bad pedagogy. The target is learning outcome, not grade or marks.

Benjamin Bloom developed Blooms taxonomy in 1948. It can be used for the tool for outcome based education. Benjamin Bloom's Taxonomy for Learning Domains has a deeper insight on the development of student. His original taxonomy focused on three domains: Cognitive, Affective and Psychomotor. The most useful domain is cognitive domain. It refers to intellectual capabilities of the students that is thinking and reasoning. Cognitive domain provides a framework for acquiring knowledge and can assist teachers while designing learning activities and assessments. Cognitive domain comprises six development categories such as creating, evaluating, analyzing, applying, understanding and remembering. These categories support the development of a student's intellectual aptitudes and skills. Blooms taxonomy can be used to help to identify the type of assessment

which is appropriate to support the cognitive level of development in students. By using a cognitive domain, assignments can be better defined and target specific levels of the development more accurately. Cognitive domain is appropriate to the student outcome and products.

In the Blooms cognitive matrix, there are tools such as television shows, text reading, and magazine articles. A learner can use specific verbs to create something. This includes compose, create, design, prepare, arrange or produce. Another category of Blooms cognitive matrix is evaluation which comprises verbs like judge, measure, assess, predict, argue, critique etc. Learners can use these verbs in the case studies, projects, appraisals, and self-evaluation. They can use the database analogues such as video reflections, Google docs, blackboard discussion boards, Google communities etc. The next category is analyzing in which the learners can use verbs such as investigate, categorize, differentiate, examine, debate, question, compare, while, test, relate etc. They can use these verbs in tests, quizzes, assignments, class discussions, critical works, surveys, syllogisms, questionnaire and report. Applying is the important cognitive category which includes verbs such as illustrate, implement, demonstrate, discuss and use. Learners can use these verbs in demonstrations. One more cognitive category is understanding that comprises verbs like describe, identify, translate, interpret, report, summarize. Learners can use these verbs in examples, illustrations, worksheets, stories, cartoons, speeches, dramas and Remembering is last category that includes verbs such as memorize, recall, recognize, retention, repeat, describe. Affective domain refers to emotions and behavior of the students. It also concentrates of attitudes and feelings. While psychomotor domain refers to manual and physical skills which basically concentrates on skills and applications of knowledge. Blooms taxonomy helps us to assess the students with concentrating on the cognitive, affective and psychomotor domains.

Benjamin Bloom talks about the taxonomy. We can certainly going to write our learning outcomes in a better way. Cognitive domain related to the mental aspect. He talks about knowledge as the first level. Bloom's model is invaluable in the field of education. Linda Dunegan raised a question on Bloom's taxonomy. Blooms theory is linear theory. Nothing innovation happens here. She says that it is doubt whether Bloom's Taxonomy fully represent the standard and outcomes for the student's in today's society. She identified five categories of learning outcomes for any course of study: Base Knowledge, Hard Career Skills, Soft Transferable Skills, Attitudes and Values and Habits of Mind. Linda focuses on professionalism, real world problems, clear communication, critical thinking, ethical judgment, working with diverse population, creativity and innovation and evaluating information for credibility. Linda goes beyond Bloom's taxonomy to include habit of mind. She says that these methods can best define and incorporate our learning outcomes and writing rubrics.

Rubrics is the alternative method which comprises portfolio creation, small group diagnosis, observation summaries, reflective student essays, interview and focus group. Cooperative experiences, discussions and its variations, caste writing or analysis, social media based assignments, Socratic Questioning and variations, working models, real world simulations, laboratory research, book reviews, take

home examinations, preparing bibliography, craft and artefact based, videos and multimedia based and event based rubrics are also useful in the holistic development of a student. These alternative methods help students to think more and to be creative.

Conclusion

Rubric is an assessment tool that focuses on learning goals. It is not sticking to grading criteria always. Rubrics which match with intended learning outcomes are considered as best rubrics. In the rubrics teachers enable students by putting inferences before them which can be meaningful, appropriate, and fair to all relevant subgroups of students. Rubrics can use patterns of success to assess the strength and weaknesses of the process. Rubrics as a way of generating valid and reliable data at the institutional level. Changing our model of assessment is not based on the curricular but on the intersection of creativity, technology, and the logic or learning. Rubric can help faculty measure meaningful outcomes of the students at classroom or department level. Rubrics are powerful tool for both teaching and assessment. It provides clarity for both the academicians and students.

Introduction:

Basically research is systematic and controlled investigation of the facts, ideas and issues by using empirical verified hypothesis. It is empirical and critical investigation of hypothetical propositions about the presumed relations among natural phenomena. Since it involve experience and critical reasoning, it may be regarded as the most successful approach in the discovery of truth. Research is also defined as an investigation or understanding an issue or asking and answering complex question or solving a problem.

Throughout the years, research has been constructing and developing the knowledge of the world. Western and Eastern epistemology contributed in the construction of humanities research. In the construction of theoretical premise on the humanities, it was the Greek epistemology or theory of knowledge has remarkable contribution. The name Socrates is central in the construction of epistemology of ethics, human values which are quintessential in humanities research and humanities. He was moralist and manifested ethics and virtues with his words and deeds. He was one of the moralists who was interested in any kind of knowledge that would lead to good human conduct and condemned all vices and acts of wickedness which he attributed to ignorance. In the midst of thriving injustices in the Athenian society of his days, he lives austerely according to the moral principles and protested against to collaborate the evil designs of the government of the day. Socratic contributions were mainly in the form of ideas and values. He transmitted his ideas though the dialogues and not through the writings or giving great speeches in the public sectors. This was come to known as dialectics. The dialectics was in the form of questions and answers. Later Hegel and Karl Marx developed the theory of dialects. They portrayed dialectics as conflict between two opposite forces. The Socratic Method constitutes of conversation of people, asking them questions and helping them to seek the answers. By employing the method of dialogue, Socrates developed elicit questions and dialectic method to understand the social or political truth. He has made the conversations with all those who had a reputation for wisdom in the Greece. However, there is interface between Socratic philosophy and contemporary scientific method. He considers that the investigation of the nature of the universe is of far less important than to understand what it meant to be a human being. Thus Socrates brought a new perspective in looking to the world where human being, his culture, behavior, life and morals became quintessential. He then said that natural philosophy is also important rather it is less important than human philosophy. With a due respect to Pythagoras, Thales, Heraclitus and Anaximenes, Socrates developed his dialogues about human understanding. Plato's Phaedo gives Socratian understanding of Delphic percept that is Know Thyself. Socrates says that it is wrong to neglect the study of human being and concentrate on only natural philosophy.

Even Plato developed dialectic method and theorized it in detail. He developed it as an art of discussion, through which the scholars can arrive at the truth. By exchanging logical argument about the human being can bring the ultimate solution to it. He says that dialectic method as the process of provoking the truth by means of questions which aims at opening out what is already discreetly known. This dialectic method is also called as Socratic Method in which Socrates attempts to examine someone's beliefs and argues by counter-investigating his opponents' arguments and premises. The next method is rational method of investigation in which reason is source of knowledge. But the rational method in humanities research plays ethical role where intellectuality lack the same. The word rational is defined

from Latin term 'ratio' which means reason. It is a method or theory in which the criterion of the truth is not a sensory but intellectual and deductive. Rationalism holds that genuine knowledge cannot come from sense perceptions and experience but must have its foundation in thought or reason. Rationalism gives emphasis on a priori reason which means knowledge obtained through prior to experience. Rationalism is also known as Continental Rationalism which was developed by Descartes.

In the pure science empirical method has been used to collect the data to get the statistical solutions. It is generally taken to mean collection of data on which to base a theory or derive a conclusion in science. Rather in humanities research we use this method to collect the data only and it is not used always to find out the truth out of political or social issues. Modern research can be generally classified as rationalistic and empirical as they accept reason or experience respectively as a source and norm of knowledge. Empiricism in humanities contrasted with the pure science school of thought known as rationalism. Empirical research basically based on the experience and not on the reason. According to empiricism, human mind at the time of birth is tabula rasa or clean slate. The mind is being compared to a blank writing tablet. It is sense experience as source of knowledge. Sensation and reflection the outer and the inner senses experience the only windows through which the dark chamber of mind comes to be filled with light. However empiricism denies intuition which enables us to grasp general truths about reality independently of experience. It accepts only inductive method which is a process of reasoning from a part to a whole from particulars to general and individuals to universals. John Locke developed this theory in a wider sense. Even Berkeley and David Hume developed this theory thoroughly. Empirical method paved the way to very practical basis of knowledge. Rational method makes the use of reason only as a tool of knowledge that will lead a baseless ground. Reason does not perform its function unless something is carried on to it in and through the sense experiences. Truth is basically a posteriori. Through which the empirical method has its own drawbacks still it served a valid basis for the demonstration of the truth.

Theodor Adorno and Habermas developed the critical theory to look into social and political issues. Hebermas is inherent in the way structure of social action and language. In dealing for the contemporary pattern of ideology and the process of emancipation, he proposes the transcendence of such system of distorted communication. Here his theory exposes the forms of manipulation and its impact on the society. He attempted to develop a theory of society with practical intention. Hid theory constitutes to offer a meticulous account of the relation between theory and practice in all humanities. He protests against the domination of scientism. He reflected on the nature of cognition, the form of social inquiry and the primary base of socio-cultural aspect of the society. He wanted to develop the contemporary social thought which has no connection with traditional social thoughts and values. He says that there should be assessment and reformation of social values of past. He proposes that there should be one to one correspondence between scientific revolution and notions of freedom, justice, happiness and selfrealization. He said the western society has witnessed nihilism and threatening pattern of modernity and enlightenment. It paved the way of dogmatism and superstition, fragmentation and discontinuity with loss of meaning and reactionary response to modernity. Modern literary critics and theorists proposed analytic method. It became quintessential in the beginning of twentieth century. The term analysis denotes meticulous analysis of complex structures of literary works. Twentieth century literature such as The Theatre of the Absurd, Epic Theatre proposed by Bertolt Brecht, Novels of Stream of Consciousness, Beat Writing, Surrealistic Fictions, Existentialist and Expressionistic fictions have complex structures. To understand the poems, fictions and plays, analytic method is quintessential.

Russian Formalism or Formalistic Method proposes text as self-contained organism. Russian formalists like Jan Mukarovasky, Viktor Shklovsky, Boris Tomashevsky, Roman Jacobson and Vladimir Propp proposed close readings of the forms of the poems. They advocated text as a self-contained organism. It is form of the text generates and determines the meaning. Viktor Shklovsky's "Art as Device" proposes the artistic devices of the poems enhance the meaning. Formalists made the major distinction between 'story' (fabula) and 'plot' (sjuzhet). Here story denotes chronological sequence of the events and incidents and plot make the modification of story. Plot denotes the method of story-telling. The events in the plot artistically arranged by means of such devices as style, repetition, parallelism. Russian formalistic method is mechanistic methodology that abridged literary works to a variation and combination of techniques and devices. An artifact is an organism which is structured whole and it is hierarchically integrated. Russian formalist method follows binary oppositions of the artistic devices of the text. Mikhail Bakhtin believes that literary work is dialogue. The meaning of the literary work generates out of the interactions of the characters, authors. He strongly opposed to the formalistic perspective of dealing with literary work and proposed heteroglossia, dialogism and chronotope as making a significant contribution to the realm of literary scholarship. Heteroglossia denotes the base condition governing the operation of

meaning in utterance. Chronotope deals with the configurations of time and space that are represented in language and discourse. It is a unit of analysis for studying language according to the temporal and spatial categories represented in that language.

Structuralist and post-structuralist methods bring the culmination in the analysis and interpretation of literary works. Roland Barthes and Claude Levi Strauss developed structuralist method which is concerned with the aesthetic or literary features of the text. They went beyond the formalistic method to consider the application of those features across many texts or genres of art. New Historicism used the method of discursive practices and Clifford Geertz' method of thick description of the historical facts is the important methods proposed in twentieth century. The hermeneutic method of Edmund Husserl denotes theory and methodology of interpretation of literary texts, wisdom literature and philosophical texts, and biblical texts. Modern hermeneutics includes both verbal and non-verbal communications and dealing with semiotic and pragmatic interpretation. Hermeneutic research emphasizes subjective interpretation of art, culture and society. Edmund Husserl went beyond the interpretation of Biblical texts and proposed this method in understanding the modern cultures. While Husserl focused on understanding beings or phenomena, he used Heidegger's Dasein which refers to experience of being that is particular to human beings.

Conclusion:

Science and technology permeate the indispensable parts of our lives rather, but methods of humanities research proved that ethics and values are quintessential. It is way of giving a new face to humanities research through the methods and methodologies of diverse literary, social and political philosophers and scholars.

Secondly, the study identified textual features of Arthur Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes' detective short stories by rejecting socio-political and biographical considerations. It illustrated the framework and method of detective genre by applying various narrative theoretical concepts. The study figured out the prerequisite qualities of detective genre and focused on the typology of detective fiction.

Objectives of the Study:

This study concentrated on the following objectives to achieve the directed result by the meticulous interpretation and analysis of narrative strategies of detective short stories of Arthur Conan Doyle:

- To identify textual features of Sherlock Holmes' selected short stories.
- To understand the nature and function of detective short stories.
- To illustrate the framework and method of detective genre.
- To figure out the prerequisite qualities of detective genre and to focus on its typology.

Interpretation:

This study employs a textual analysis of the detective genre. The study analyzes and interprets the primary texts by using various technical concepts. The topic of the research being analytical, hence it claims for various research methods and techniques that would be applied to analyze the selected short stories and bring out the real value of the research.

Arthur Conan Doyle's detective stories made brilliant culmination in the field of narration by subverting earlier methods of writing story. Short story in its use of action is nearer to drama than to the novel. For the specific effect of adventure, Doyle employed concept of well-made play in his narration. It records incidents and accidents, swift movement, unexpected development, leading through suspense to climax and a satisfying denouement. (Bates, p. 16) The stuff of drama such as action, romance, murder, suspense, heroics, pity, terror, passion, lifethreatening conflict, curiosity, suspense, climax and poetic justice becomes an inevitable part of his narration. There are diverse stories such as fables, myths, legends which have conventional patterns. (Sherman, p. 518) It also highlights how Doyle tells story with an indisputable epigrammatic accuracy. Doyle creates interest, narrative dynamism, so that any attentive reader is rapidly caught up in the story and eager by its final paragraphs to find out how matters conclude.

This paper also focuses on strategies of using plot. Detective stories defamiliarize pattern of events which create an unexpected suspense and wonder to the reader and demand emotional response from him. By subverting fairytale method of story-telling, detective story stands on different stance. It comprises concepts such as foreshowing, metonymy, whodunit, indices and flashback to make detective stories more

effective and forceful. The study also focuses on the formal beauty of Arthur Canon Doyle's detective short stories. It considers overall performance of narrative power of detective short stories. Detective story is basically a form of entertainment and it demands various responses from the reader. The formal perfection of the work creates aesthetic beauty. It attempts to show how Sherlock Holmes detective stories create an impression on the reader by fulfilling their intention. The aesthetics is matter of response as well as what is intrinsic. It is not as an artifact, a physical object; it is rather our interpretation of it

Arthur Conan Doyle's detective stories, establishing themselves in distinct and conspicuous position, subvert the earlier types of plot structure of any narrative or dramatic genre. Every single story in the five anthologies typifies the prerequisite qualities of detective genre. His story structure subverts the structure of fairy tales, folktales and well-made play.

Tzvetan Todorov in Typology of Detective Fiction introduces innovative and groundbreaking structure of detective stories. This structure is basically applicable to all short stories of Doyle. Todorov proposes: 'The detective fiction contains not one but two stories: the story of the crime and the story of the investigation. (Lodge, p. 175). Doyle follows same steps to make the detective stories more convincing, persuasive and forceful. His detective short stories create intellectual curiosity, a rational inquisitiveness, logical concentration, scholarly interest and ultimately unexpected expectancy or suspense in the reader's mind only through the revolutionary plot structure of his detective short stories and his plausible deduction of the evidences. Red-headed League typifies the structure of detective story properly. Watson visits Holmes one day, only to find him in conversation with a fat, old-haired fellow. This person is pawnbroker, Mr. Jabez Wilson, who



has come to Homes because he has been the victim of a practical joke. He wants to get to the bottom of it.

Red-headed League typifies the structure or plot of detective story properly. Watson visits Holmes one day, only to find him in conversation with a fat, old red-haired fellow. This person is a pawnbroker, Mr. Jabez Wilson, who has come to Holmes because he has been the victim of a practical joke and wants to get to the bottom of it.

The prerequisite structure or formula of Arthur Conan Doyle's detective short stories is unconventional. Red-headed League story opens up with backdrop (in medias res) that means discussions of earlier incidents or crimes. It is an exposition where the usual topic of discussion is of past cases illustrating Home's superior analytical ability. In this story, Holmes and Watson discuss earlier case especially The Case of Identity. The story further starts with sudden and unexpected arrival of the harbinger or client. The client often gives an account of their problems often in the form of back story while Watson takes note of them. We see the arrival of Jabez Wilson at Holmes who is client. This unexpected arrival is dramatic exposition of the story. The third part of the story is based on the narrated evidence. Jabez Wilson narrates some facts which are doubtful. He gives description of Mr. Vincent Spoulding and his activity. This part is also known as prolepsis (flashforward) which arouses suspicion and doubt of the evidence. The next part of the story is false hypothesis of the narrated or discussed evidences. It is totally based on intellectual inquisitiveness where false assumptions can be made on the culprit. Watson goes with false hypothetical premises about the criminal activity. He interprets evidences wrongly and asks diverse questions to Holmes. Holmes does not disclose the fact. He puts the whole incidents into suspense. From the clues presented which are also called as metonymic devices, Holmes employs superior reasoning and makes some preliminary hypothesis which Watson misinterprets the clues. The next part of the story is visiting the location where the action has been taken place. Holmes visits Jabez Wilson's pawnshop and observes the fact minutely. Sometimes Holmes goes with false detection. The officials also guess the incident wrongly. The police and other detectives make erroneous conclusions and arrive at false solutions. In this story, Holmes assures to solve the case by Monday. Holmes goes into deep meditation on the case and conceals the case finally. This part creates dramatic tension. Further part is the denouement in which Holmes calls Peter Jones, the police officer and Mr. Merryweather director of the bank to find out the criminal. They catch John Clay, Chief of the Red Headed League. And the final part is analepsis (flashback) where Holmes with his deductive reasoning explains everything and comes to the solution to the unfathomable clues. These aspects are so logically connected with each other and finally bring suspense and create entertainment. The aesthetics of Doyle's short stories lie in the formal pattern, and rearrangement of the incidents and events.

Plot refers to narrative structure of the text. It incorporates wholeness and harmony of various narrative ingredients. Aristotle insists beginning, middle and end of drama as most effective part of dramatic structure. This is applicable to the detective genre. Detective story is representation of incidents and events derived from solitary situation and single episode, complete it itself with synthesis of narrative ingredients (organic whole), with highly condensed and compressed magnitude, enriched by impenetrable codes and unfathomable metonymic clues, which arouse intellectual inquisitiveness of the reader and finally brings scholarly clarification through the art of deduction.



The detective short story's one more advantage is its ideal length which is ample enough to create an intense and enduring impression. But short enough to be experienced at one sitting to produce a temporary exultation of the soul in the reader. (Poe, p. 2). Doyle's detective short stories are unique in their ideal amplitude. Doyle brings brevity and unity in his stories by employing single plot structure. His every story does not cross two thousand words. Like Holmes' art of deduction, his stories embody reasonable length. His A Scandal in Bohemia, Red-headed League, The Greek Interpreter, The Adventure of Six Napoleons, The Adventure of Missing Three-Quarter, The Second Stain and The Adventure of Red Circle, are the best in maintaining the length. These stories justifiably embody not more than ten thousand words. Another important aspect of detective short story is a whodunit which is plot driven and complex device of the short story. It basically means asking to the evidences a question with inquisitiveness: Who has done it? (Lodge, p. 176) The reader is provided with the clues where the identity of the culprit becomes unfathomable matter. This device also creates suspense and surprise because it is hidden and latent with unfathomable hints.

Metonymy is narrative device by which a part is put for the whole. This can be as simple as a close-up, where a part of a person such as hands, hair fingers, are supposed to represent the person. Metonymy is also the rhetorical strategy of describing something indirectly by referring to things around it. It is described as a part for the whole. It covers whole variety of verbal and non-verbal impenetrable phenomena including unfathomable language like abbreviations, clippings of words and codes. It also comprises circumstantial evidences, occurrences, clues. Holmes in The Yellow Face observes Mr. Grant Munro's smoking pipe and presumes his physical appearance, habit, psychological condition. Such

kinds of observation become his logical exercise. He infers the client's as disturbed and restless because the client forgets the *pipe* in Holmes residence. Holmes goes further in analyzing the pipe the person left in the room whose name is Mr. Grant Munro. He says this pipe is valuable to Munro and he loves it because he repairs it rather than replacing, when it was broken. In *The Boscombe Valley Mystery* Holmes goes further to analyze the footprints of unknown culprit and finally deduces that is all a plan of John Turner.

The physical appearance becomes a metonymic device which signifies much implication in finding the culprit. Holmes in Red Headed League traps the criminal and explains how he observed the fact. When Holmes visits the pawnshop, he observes that the knees of Spaulding's pants are filthy. Through this he comes to the conclusion that filthy pants are signs of prolonged digging. This research paper focuses on the formal beauty of Arthur Canon Doyle's detective short stories. It considers overall performance of narrative power of detective short stories. Detective story is basically a form of entertainment and it demands various responses from the reader. The formal perfection of the work creates aesthetic beauty. The study attempts to show how Sherlock Holmes detective stories create an impression on the reader by fulfilling their intention. The aesthetics is matter of response as well as what is deep down. It is not only the artifact of detective short story creates aesthetics but also our interpretations of the stories also create aesthetics.

Conclusion:

The aesthetics of Arthur Conan Doyle's short stories is an outcome of well-constructed formal patterns and powerful narrative devices. The beauty of his detective short stories exist in their singleness (unity) of impression, organic whole of narrative devices and narrative structure. The



beauty lies in the narrative devices which create suspense and wonder. Sherlock Holmes stories typify the best the quintessence of detective stories. They frame the fundamental inquisitiveness among the reader. Unlike cathartic effect, it creates an intellectual appeal and holds readers' attention. It gives myriad impressions and basically improves the readers' aesthetic sense.

Inadequate infrastructural facilitates and improper funding distribution to the higher education institution is major problem. Rastriya Uchhatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CPC), launched in 2013. It has been taking initiative in providing strategic funding to eligible state higher education institutions. But this body is making rich to the rich institutions. Institutions from the villages and minority institutions quintessentially need the funds, but RUSA has been constantly neglecting the colleges from shantytowns and villages. In RUSA 1.0 Scheme, it has been provided funds to those institutions which are already established such as Indian Institutions of Technology (IITs) and Government Colleges. In RUSA 2.0 Scheme, it concentrated its blessing on the well-known colleges and universities. This is farce in Indian education system. UGC has also stopped its funding to the institutions which are economically and culturally weaker in the society. So the implementation of the funding is not proper in the higher education in India. So the desirable quality institutions are only remained in the dreams.

The government of Indian thinks that the next problem in the Indian higher education is theoretical education and low employability. According to them, the curriculum of Indian education system is not desirably implemented by the institutions. Currently, UGC introduced National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) to non-technical institutions. This kind of program has been introduced because only small proportions of Indian graduates are considered employable. They think that placement outcomes also drop significantly as we move away from the practical education. This is totally wrong to introduce skilled education to the student of humanities and social science. The government is biased to the arts and

Art, literature and social science education is meant to inculcate ethical, moral and spiritual values in the students rather than to make machine to them. We look to education in commercial way. The main function of humanities departments is to inculcate values, to teach and to delight. The spiritual health is ultimate aim of the humanities department. So many courses have been introduced by universities and institutions which create confusion among the students. The list of courses and unaffordable fee structure to the students of villages and shantytowns is major challenge.

In the villages, the problem of load-shedding of energy is major problem. But still the UGC, NAAC and other regulatory bodies of MHRD force us to commence online courses. National Accreditation and Assessment Council insists 'liberalization and globalisation of economic activities, need to develop skilled human resources of a high caliber'. (NAAC, Institutional Accreditation: Manual for Affiliated Colleges, 2017, p.6) There is no provision to the student who is economically below poverty line. UGC has instated every institution to introduce CBCS pattern to the students of higher education. But is there any provision to the selection of the teachers, their honorarium and the separate time table for the new courses. So the shortage of faculty and high student ratio is central problem in the higher education institutions. Choice based credit system is one of the major problems in India Higher Education system. Government is very passive about the new recruitment and their focus is on temporary teachers with clock hour basis. To introduce the new initiative like Choice Based credit system is new challenge. Flexibility in the syllabus is really appreciative and praiseworthy but teaching of choice based subjects need new time table, extra faculty with reasonable honorarium to them is quite unbearable and unmanageable. Most of the universities and Higher Education institutions are passive about Choice Based Credit System.

One more reason for the degeneration of Indian higher education system is low quality research work. Most of the research papers, projects, theses and articles are not authentic and original. The research works are not contributing to the development of Indian society. So this is a kind of intellectual consumerism. Intellectual consumerist attitude is not inculcating the utilitarian values among the society. Impact factor is one more farce which creates the challenge in the Indian education system. Impact factor to the local problems are low. Even the local issue which is published in any research journal has not been valued by the Indexes and Citations. So the international journals, citations, indexes and impact factors

India lacks the proper educational budget to and its expenditure to solve the problems of colleges and universities. So the low budgets and wrong educational policy creates such kind of disaster in the higher education. Now a days, UGC introduced Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE) to confirm the prevention of academic delinquency that comprises plagiarism in academic writing among research candidates. There are some reasons behind the introduction of these new journals. They promote high quality research, publication ethics and academic integrity. They also promote to prevent dubious and predatory journals. This sounds like authentication of intellectual authority. Most of the CARE Journals listed under the SCOPUS index. Some CARE Journal lists comprise the Journals from abroad. If the writer knows regional language and having research with local issues, the CARE Journals do not consider this. There are local issues like farmer's suicide, problems and prospects of tribal communities, criminal and nomadic tribes. A researcher with local language cannot reach to CARE Journals, because language becomes the major barrier to him. So the CARE journals lack the considerations of Local Thinking.

Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) with the help of Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) commenced innovative idea of education site that is Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM). It is Massive Open Online Course which is freed to the students. This kind of education system transformed *chalk and talk method* into *Technically Enabled Class* with images and graphs. Off course this is very innovative initiative. But is it affordable to the students of below poverty line? To start online education, the basic infrastructural facility like smart-boards, computers, laptops, tabs are essential. Institutions which are in economic crisis have been lacking the budget to start such kind of Online Education. Even a smartphone, internet bill is not affordable to the underprivileged student. Indian education system must acquaint our students globally as well as there should be local connection. If this happens in every institution, India will definitely prove itself worth and meaningful. The core values of Indian Education system are best, but the proper implémentation is lacking.

Human Resource Development, Government of India introduced *National Education Policy. 2019* which is 'founded on the guiding goals of access, equity, quality, affordability and accountability'. (K. Kasturirangan, 3). It focuses on an India-centred education system that contributes directly to transforming our nation sustainably into an equitable and vibrant

knowledge society, by providing high quality education to all. The major provisions of The National Education Policy are well-resourced multidisciplinary institutions, broad based liberal arts undergraduate education with flexible curricular structures, creative combinations of study, multiple entry and exit points. It also advocates professional education as an integral part of higher education institutions and empowered governance and autonomy for higher education institutions. It has also provision to establish National Research Foundation (NRF) to catalyze research and innovation. The New Education Policy carves new institutional architecture. There will be consolidation of current 800 universities and forty thousand institutions will be reduced into fifteen thousand. Even all higher education institutions will be consolidated into three types of institutions. Type one embraces Research Universities which has equal focus on research and teaching. Type two comprises Teaching Universities which has its primary focus on teaching with significant focus on research and type three includes autonomous degree granting colleges will be almost exclusively focus on teaching. This is the major challenge in the realm of higher education. If the forty thousand institutions will be reduced into fifteen thousand institutions, there will be big loss of the teachers working in the institution. It will be challenging to accommodate the remaining teachers into the new system.

The National Education Policy also advocates the liberal education with broad multidisciplinary exposure. It also mentions the terms like creative combination of disciplines of study. It also refers master's and doctoral education which provides research based specializations. The major problem of this education system is centralized syllabus. This can create chaos without consideration of geographical, cultural and societal problems and prospects. Any syllabus need to consider the bottommost students and consider the views of stakeholders to frame the syllabus. The Education Policy used the phrase 'traditional value system of Seva, Nishkam Karma' (The National Education Policy, p. 96) and even they used one more phrase such as 'traditional knowledge system' (The National Education Policy, p. 99). These phrases sound like one-sided approach and outlook towards the education. It seems like denunciation of other religion and enunciation of particular religion. This leads to partial, inequitable and misleading approach towards other religions. India is heterogeneous circle which comprises diverse cultures, communities, ideologies, beliefs. But the vague and ambiguous phrases tend to signify biased and unfair attitude to the other religions and cultures. The National Education Policy is not all-inclusive and encompassing rather it is

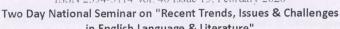

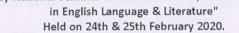

They consider its consequence on the physical, psychological, intellectual and cultural well-being of colonized people.

5| Analysis:

Edward Said's seminal book *Orientalism* (1978) investigates the Anglocentric views of language. He concentrates on the portrayals of Orients within writing and as a people, through studying various works he unlocks the misconceptions made in Western culture. Edward Said attacks on the Eurocentric views on oriental and indigenous persons which are represented in history,

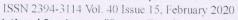

literature, religious scriptures and other arts. Said goes against to the misinterpretations of western writers, historian and literary writers.

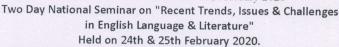
Edward Said attacks on the view of Friedrich Schlegel, a French philologist. He starts to look at the languages of orient as uncivilized, uncultured and rough-edged. This is colonial policy. This is a cultural hegemony to possess on the colonized. This is again a Eurocentric outlook on the oriental language which is false and fictitious statement. Edward Said brings out Friedrich Schlegel's biased perspective about orient languages represented in myths and literature. Friedrich Schlegel was 19th century French philologists. He studied Sanskrit language in Paris. He also studied Semitic language, Chinese and African language. He proposes that the language of Semites and the language of Shakuntala, The Zend Avastha and The Upanishada is backward, unaesthetic, agglutinative (difficult with complex word order), and mechanical. He protests against the idea proposed in Walter Scott's novel Talisman which diminishes the genesis of Muslims and sublimates Christianity. He admits that these eastern languages are different, inferior, low-graded and mediocre.

Edward Said says that textual attitude is false to understand the truth. Said says that human life is understood by text. What books says that becomes authentic in the society. But sometimes these texts falsely interpret the world. For example, Bible is myth and it interprets the world more symbolic way. This book does not represent the reality. Voltaire's Candide and Cervantes' Don Quixote are the books do not tell the true history of the Spain. The above books are falseinterpretation or misinterpretation of the world. Said says that there is no one to one correspondence between the text and reality. The first move Said makes in his essay is establishing the textual attitude of writers and reader. He says the language of the colonial texts creates false-consciousness among the orients.

Ngugi Wa Thiong'o's Decolonising the Mind: The Politics of Language in African Literature (1986) is a critical treatise advocates for linguistic decolonization. The book helps us to strengthen his preeminent voice theorizing the language debate in postcolonial studies. He proposes that language of Africa is not just alien entity or autonomous medium rather it is connected deeply with societies, communities and psychology as well. He advocates his own language Gikuyu which is pervasive and socio-cultural force to him. Gikuyu is most natural and pervasive language to express African mind and culture. Language is medium of communication as well as it is carrier of culture. Language carries culture and culture carries the orature and literature. Language carries entire bodies of values by which a person can come to perceive himself or herself and his or her identity in the world. Language is indispensible part from ourselves as a community of us with specific history related to us. He proposes that how native language has specifically associated with specific form and character. Ngugi says that language is socio-cultural force, which carries histories, values and aesthetics of culture. Ngugi Wa Thiong'o states, "Language as culture is the collective memory bank of a people's experience in history. Culture is almost indistinguishable from the language that makes possible its genesis, growth, banking, articulation, and indeed its transmission from one generation to the next." (Post-colonial Studies Reader, p. 289) He says the author who is not an African and he writes about Africa and its culture. The question arises here whether the work of non-African writer qualify for expressing African mind. As he proposes that the borrowed tongues cannot carry the weight of African experience. Only the proverbs, clutches, idioms, folklores can express African mind and culture. African language has its own rhythm and that speech rhythm cannot be expressed through borrowed tongues. "Language was not mere string of words. It had a suggestive

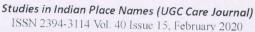

power well beyond the immediate and lexical meaning. Our appreciation of suggestive magical power of language was reinforced by the games we played with words through riddles, proverbs, transposition of syllables, or through nonsensical but musically arranged words. So we learnt the music of our language on the top of the content". (*Post-colonial Studies Reader*, p. 287).

Ngugi outwits colonialism which has been deliberately undervaluing "people's culture, their art, dances, dances, religions, history, geography education, orature and literature" (Post-colonial Studies Reader, p. 290). The language of African child's formal education is foreign and the language of his conceptualization is also foreign. So there is no one to one correspondence between his school language and the language he uses in his own environment like family and community. There is dissociation of sensibility between what the child learns and how he lives in natural and social environment. The disassociation or alienation becomes clear when colonial language becomes carrier of culture. English as a colonial language is most artificial language to express the culture of Africa. This he calls as "colonial alienation" or process of making "colonial child". (Decolonising the Mind, p. 391). Ngugi argues that English is cultural bomb that annihilates pre-colonial histories and identities, people's belief in their names, in their environments and in their heritage of struggle. Ngugi offers anti-imperialistic perspective while writing literature, history and culture of his or her nation. He farewells the English language from African continent which has been making 'colonial child' to many Africans.

Marjery Fee's Who Can Write as Other focuses on the legitimate representation of the facts through language. Authenticity of fact has not been written in alien language. The facts of minority have been written in the style of majority style and particularly in English. She says that the native writer has to

write about their own experiences. The work written by the 'other' cannot be totally neutral and prejudice and stereotype free. She says that the idea of authenticity is myth, relative and context bound. Bill Ashcraft proposes that English text unable to communicate a non-English cultural meaning. English texts are based on the misconception of the way language means. E. K. Brathwaite demonstrates Nation language as language which attempts to recover lost origins, linguistic variations of the region. Braj Kachru determines English language as ethnographic tool to express native reality. He states, "The English language is a tool of power, domination and elitist identity and of communication across continent." (*Postcolonial Studies Reader*, p. 291). He proposes English has gained neutrality in view to express ethnographic reality. To him, English has got neutrality, new power base and new elitism represent indigenous culture.

Language anglophiles generally regard English as a master of all languages even though it is not their indigenous language. The indifference for their own language and sublime for English language is the prejudiced attitude deeply rooted in the anglophile characters. To them, the English language is associated with modernity and freedom. This concern about language is authoritative, discriminative biased and hegemonic. Homi Bhabha in his *Location of Culture* discusses that people look colonial language in somewhat language of culture, language of intellectuality, language of modernity and standardization. He even says there must be epistemological, impersonal and rational perspective towards cultural diversity. He thinks that people are losing constantly their first space/indigenous space in the multicultural situation. In the hybrid or *third space*, the selfhood, language and culture become *ambivalent*. They divert their own endangered language because it is the language of downtrodden, language of

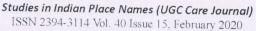

Kiran Desai's *The Inheritance of Loss* deals with same problem. Kiran Desai's *The Inheritance of Loss* explores with insight various contemporary international issues such as multiculturalism, modernity, impact of globalization, life of immigrants, hybridization and anglophilia. Jemubhai Popatlal Patel, the protagonist, is not an Anglicized Gujarati Judge who could assimilate into the cultures of his origin because of his desire to mimic the English colonial identity nor could he fully don the much coveted Western identity. *Anglophilia* is major issue in the Indian English novels. It is an idea has quintessential value for even postcolonial literature since the English have left an ineradicable impression over the colonized nations. long after they have gone. Anglophile characters have some view towards English language and culture that is sublime and uplifting and sometimes they feel inferior about their indigenous language.

6] Conclusion:

The propositions made by the postcolonial writers and theorists offer diversity of views regarding language. Some are pro-English writers and some protest against the Eurocentric views about language. Postcolonial literature even projects the consequence of anglophile characters. The anglophile characters have been torn between English language and indigenous language. English language causes big loss to the indigenous culture, history and language. The postcolonial writers with their meticulous observations investigate the authenticity or genuineness of native language and the false consciousness and hegemonic attitude of English as a foreign language.

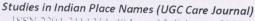

Abstract:

Dalit literature traces back its origin in revolutionary struggle of Dalits against socioeconomic, cultural and religious manipulation of rigid cultures, orthodox religions and
conservative ethnic groups. It mainly highlights on the victimization of Dalits and the forms
of oppression. It brings the consciousness of being Dalit in the context of established,
authorized and legitimized classes, castes, religions and races. This research paper
concentrates on unique nature of Dalit literature. The paper also attempts to show the
significance of victimization of Dalits which they found in the optimism of freedom from
torture, oppression, manipulation of established castes in India.

Key Words: Dalit, Hegemony, Established Caste, Grand Narrative, Orthodox, Resistance, Aesthetics etc.

Introduction:

The Dalit writers figure out the oppression of Dalit protagonist in his or her struggle, patience, optimism, education against the torture, suffering and cruelty of the established upper-castes. It found its aesthetics in the strong views and ideologies of Buddha, Phule, Shahu and Ambedkar. Dalit literature protests against most of the mythological and metaphysical idea of Hinduism such as manipulation, divinity, inequality, authority, discrimination and finally enunciation of Hindu rituals and beliefs. It is also called as aesthetics of resistance and aesthetics of revolution against all orthodox views of Hindu philosophy.

This awareness of victimization in the social, economic, cultural and religious context makes Dalit more revolutionary, depressed, fragmented and alienated. Rather some philosophical background of Phule, Shahu and Ambedkar brings hope and optimism to fight against all the brutalities, authorities and perpetuated values of dominant castes and religions. Their views like education, liberty, equality, superiority, harmony and humanity bring wonderful hopes and anticipations among the Dalits. Their literature actively worked for the deconstruction of conservative and traditional identities linked with Dalits and

depressed classes. The views of all the above writes make the renaissance and upliftment of oppressed Dalits in India.

Analysis:

The writers from established classes and castes write literature is mainly known as mainstream literature. Rather Dalit writers who write about their own pain, agony, grief, pathos and anguish become the alternative stream of writing. It either becomes parody of mainstream literature or subversion of grand narratives. The mainstream literature represented beautiful thoughts, sublime emotions, romances, heroism, mysticism and beauty of established culture. The mainstream literature is an enunciation of imagination rather than naked, unclothed and harsh reality. Dalit literature with its own distinctiveness focuses on the apocalyptic feelings, taboos, non-parliamentary actions in the beginning. It brings all unaesthetic, agglutinative feelings from the world of *ghetto*.(*Untouchables or the Children of Indian Ghetto*)

Dalit writers represented the lives of Dalits their milieu, their culture in their writings. Humanity, equality, brotherhood and freedom are the issues are the foundation of Dalit writing. Dalit writers presented very rational, ethical and social aesthetics for the Dalit literature. It is Sharankumar Limbale, Omprakash Valmiki, Arjun Dangle and Harish Mangalam rejected the aesthetics of mainstream literature.

Sharankumar Limbale is renowned Dalit writer whose appeal is "equality, freedom, justice and love which are basic sentiments of people and society. Values of equality, freedom, justice and solidarity are inherent to Dalit literature" (*Towards*, p. 119-120). These values are quintessentially important than pleasure and beauty. He says Dalit literature is not for imagination, entertainment, or for pleasure principle. It gives stance to representation of uncovered reality of Dalits. Its first aim is to create consciousness or awareness of pains and agonies of Dalits. This kind of literature is based on reality rather than beauty. He proposed and protested to that literature which "promotes equality, freedom and justice and which emphases the centrality of the human being and society". (*Towards*, p. 119) He also says that Dalit literature rejects spiritualism and abstraction, its aesthetics materialistic rather than spiritual. (*Towards*, p. 116).

Sharatchandra Muktibodh in his book What is Dalit Literature? gave details of typical elements of Dalit aesthetics. He proposes, 'Dalit sensibility seeks to bring about

compatible changes in the social consciousness, it is rebellious as well as fundamentally optimistic and revolutionary.' (*What is Dalit Literature?* p.267). He says sufferings and woes are common attributes to common reasons.

Dalit literature uses vernacular narration in their writings. Namdev Dhasal in his Golpitha (1972) uses taboos and non-parliamentary words which shows his agony and anguish against the rotten, discriminative and unsympathetic systems of upper-castes. His poems deviate all the standard norms of mainstream literature. The blasphemy of Indian ghetto is represented with harsh realities. His poem Man, You Should Explode from the anthology Golpitha expresses the freedom with using taboos. He has always non-aesthetic approach towards his life. His words and images are highly disgusting and derogatory.

Man, you should explode
Yourself to bits to start with
Jive to a savage drum beat
Smoke harsh, smoke ganja
Chew opium, bite *lalpari*Guzzle country booze- if too broke,
Down a pint of the cheapest *dalda*.

His poems do not follow any rhymes and rhythms to create aesthetic pleasure rather they represent dirty, agglutinative taboos and torturing emotions. The images and symbols are bestial, nauseating and repulsive. His emotions are hideous, vulgar and revolting. The disgust, foul, obscene and uncouth is rather shown with a full of pride. He accepts the disgust and ugliness of life as it is. He presents the uncouth, uncivilized and coarse reality in cacophonic words. Following lines from his anthology *Gandu Bagicha* (1986) present harsh discordant mixture of sounds with disgust:

O Arsefuckers park!
Your city of insatiable angels
I bear a crown of agony on my head;
A luminous fountain of African anguish;
A wound has found its home in my heart—
Even words cannot open its doors.

He puts in his own words: "There are neither flowers / not leaves; / neither trees / nor birds. / All this is mimicry by mercy of His grace." (Gandu Bagicha). His poem The Cruelty expresses incongruous and ludicrous statements.

I am broken by the revolt exploding inside me.

There is no moonlight anywhere

There's no water everywhere.

A rabid fox is tearing off my flesh with its teeth;

And a terrible venom-like cruelty

Spreads out from my monkey bone.

Namadev Dhasal proposes that poetry is a political expression. Such portrayals of underprivileged have been seen as very pathetic and contemptible characters. He uses the animal images to express beastial quality of human being. Dhasal expresses a vivid self-experience distresses, degradations, discomforts, anguishes, disturbance, miseries, scarceness, and atrocities into his own writing.

Arjun Dangle's seminal poem *Revolution* represents the inhuman attitude of conservative Hindus towards Dalits. The poem opens up with the wretched and inhuman conditions of Dalits. As a matter of fact the miserable condition of men was as worse as animal. His poems are satirical and grotesquely pathetic which counterattacks on orthodox Hindus. The pathetic conditions of Dalits presented in the poem are a satire on orthodox Hindus in general and orthodox Brahmins in particular. Dalit intellectuals participated in the movements by composing song and writing ballads, and through traditional folk art such as *tamasha* and *jalsa*.

The literary expressions of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar's philosophy and movement during his lifetime were more or less of this kind. Rejection of traditional religious culture, language and other ethnic values and growing awareness of their backward contains is the common foundation of their writing. Ambedkar made the subversion of Ancient Indian history. His narrative version is alternative and counter narrative to Vedic, Puranic views of Indian culture and history. His seminal book *Who were the Shudras?* traces back the racial history of *Shudras* in India. Dr. Ambedkar officially demolishes the authority of Vedic traditional views about social structure. Ambedkar rejected the rigid systems of caste in

India. Manusmriti a rigid religious text supports the four *varnas* in which Shudras were considered as inferior and subservient to the upper-castes. There is aversion and disgust of upper castes against downtrodden and Dalits. In his seminal book, *The Buddha and His Dhamma*, Ambedkar designates the quintessential issues which concerned him all through his life. He not only encouraged the wisdoms of Buddha but gave new understandings appropriate for the present context. His picture of Buddhism focused more on the social message of Buddha. He proposed Buddhism over other religions. The Buddhist teachings like *Pradnya*, *Karuna and Samata* gave energy to the oppressed and downtroddens. (*The Buddha and His Dhamma*, pp. 285-325). Buddhism emerged as an answer to the evils that existed in Brahminic society. Buddhism was the revolution against Brahminic society. Buddhist religion has rational potentiality with all kinds of intellectual and moral base. The distinct aesthetics that covers in Buddhism rational questions to all rituals, orthodox systems, and the ideologies based on the inequality and discrimination.

There is no such theoretical premise like Dalit aesthetics which we can explore in the literary works of Dalit writers expect Sharankumar Limbale's seminal treatise Towards an Aesthetics of Dalit Literature. Rather it is reasonably right that aesthetics of Dalit is the aesthetics of resistance which protests against the orthodox social orders and metaphysics of Hindu. Secondly, aesthetics of Dalits rejects the Indian orthodox questions of beauty, ethics. Dalit literature resists contradictory ideologies, unfathomable ethics of dominant social castes and cultures. The epistemology of Dalits is quite contradictory to the hegemonic ideas, beliefs and values of dominant social classes and castes. Dalit aesthetics concentrates more on the rejection of polytheism and cultural hegemony of the ideology of orthodox Hindu religion. Dalit aesthetics rejects the pitfalls of aesthetics which proceeded from metaphysics. It more concentrates on the materialistic and ethical perceptions of reality. It considers the diverse faculties of the public discourse on inequality, discrimination in a rigid caste system of India. Dalit aesthetics is based on the life experience of Dalits in their disastrous situations. It is quintessentially drawn from a social structure based on the principles of equality, fraternity, liberty, justice. Dalit aesthetics raises Dalit consciousness. It makes conscious to the Dalits about their inferiority, fragmentation, oppression, starvation, discrimination. This consciousness makes Dalits to reject the conservative,

It becomes a part of subversion of all grand and hegemonic way of writing.

abandoned Oedipus on a barren mountain after he was born. This injury leaves Oedipus with vivid scars for the rest of his life. Oedipus's injury represents the way in which destiny has marked and set him apart.

Oedipus Rex constitutes one more symbol of disability that is blindness. Sophocles explores blindness from two angles. First, the physical blindness which denotes an inability to see the truth Tiresias is physically blind and happens to be prophet. Tiresias' blindness is physical rather he has shown as visionary person having prophetic evidence. He represents a man who is closer to the truth that is naked truth. He says truth can be destructive. The knowledge about the fact, though it is of the past or future can sometimes become unbearable. His blindness has quite positive connotations towards physical disability. On the other hand, Oedipus is mentally blind who represents ignorance. He is totally ignorant about the truth about the fact he is unknown to this. The portrayal of blindness in Albert Camus' *The Outsider* has been deeply associated with the primitive motif represented in Sophoclean *Oedipus Rex*. The protagonist in the novel is blinded to a personal truth and are physically blinded as well. In the *Outsider*, Meursault's blindness is metaphorical, as he I negligent to his own absurdity, which he later becomes categorized as. On the other hand, Oedipus's blindness is literal, as he is ignorant to the truth of his life. In the play Oedipus Rex, Sophocles empoyes the image of blindness of Tiresias, Jocasta and Oedipus to point out how understanding is far greater that vision alone.

O'Reille's Peeling (2002) uses distorted wounded images of women and disabled actresses trapped in their multilayered costumes and confined to an unlit backstage in *Peeling*. The above mentioned playwrights show the women as distorted, powerless mothers who are expected to take responsibility of vulnerable children. Euripides attempts to show the woman who is disabled in patriarchal society. Kaite O'Reille's Peeling shows tragic women lamenting on their lost city and dead men. There are three actress Beaty, Coral and Alfa who are called as disabled characters. They are immobile who are stuck at the back and unlit on the stage not because of their disabilities but because of their multilayered prosperous frocks. Alpha is deaf and uses sign language and during the show stage directions and intermittent sign understanding supports her ability to communicate with other characters and the audience. Beaty is described as four feet tall woman and Coral is confined to electric wheelchair. With their disabilities, their big hoop skirts and their skeptical and humorous dialogues create both a comical and tragic mood. As in Beckett, the characters are tragic, comic, ridiculous and mocking. The visual contrast of these disabled women clothed in offensively oversized dresses which creates piteous images rather than comical. However their situation in which the characters cannot leave their restricted space and keep waiting between scenes wearing huge costumes they cannot handle, is similar to Beckett's portrayal of inertia.

Conclusion:

Disability is often associated with sin, offense, indulgence, crime, transgression, stigma, and kind of untouchability. Disabled woman's body has been shown with terror. It is also associated with wrongdoing, bad behavior, unlawful activity, misconduct. The images and symbols used in the traditional and modern literature are offensive, unpleasant, distasteful and disgusting. This kind of image-making makes the degradation of most of the physically and mentally impaired men and women. Modern disability study changed this perspective of looking them with constructive attitude. They emphasized on the inclusion of physical impaired in the human society. 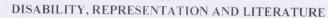

Her first book, a collection of short stories called Satyr of the Subway (1997) won her a fellowship from the Virginia Centre for Creative Arts. Her second novel Ladies Coupe (2001) being rated as 2002's top five books of the year went on to be translated into more than 25 languages around the world.

Her composition about Kerala has been included in "The Poetry India Collection and a British Council Poetry Workshop Anthology." Among her other novels are Mistress (2003) Adventures of Nonu, The Skating Squirrel (2006), Living Next Door to Alise (2007) and Magical Indian Myths (2008). She has also written a few travelogues. Her evocative style and confessional mode of narration has mesmerized the reading public in more than 27 countries where her works have been published and translated.

Ladies Coupe (2001) was rated as one of 2002's top five books of the year. This novel portrays society and also brings to fore the novelist, who possess great insight, solidarity and humour.

Men and women are created to complement each other and play parallel roles. However, the patriarchal order into which they live designate women with a secondary status. Unable to voice her feelings and concern, all that a woman can do is swallow all the humiliation and suppression behind the mask of forged happiness and feigned concern. Being the epitome of patience and sacrifice, she is not supposed to move out of the arena created by the male-made society. However, times have changed and women no longer speak from the periphery. They do not merely want to voice their concerns but also want to be heard. Women who were considered to be dumb have become audible and coming out of the mask, wish to be recognized in their 'real attire.' Women wishing to come out of the age-old shackles and releasing themselves of the burden begin to undertake a voyage towards self-discovery and self-realization.

Ladies Coupe is one such novel which deals with a woman's quest for strength and independence. At the end of the novel, we realize that every person possesses some fine qualities and inner strength which even he/ she is unaware of. It is only in the face of certain untoward incident or circumstances into which they are thrown that these qualities begin to surface. Further these qualities receive a finer edge and gloss only when faced with predicaments.

Six women find themselves together in a ladies coupe, traveling, each for her own purpose. This ladies coupe becomes a comfort zone where each one begins voicing her tale and in the process is both comforted and convinced of greater things.

Akhilandeswari (Akhila), the protagonist is a spinster in her mid-forties. The unexpected death of her father reverses roles and she becomes the sole provider of her family. "Anita Nair probably hints at the family's easy acceptance of her as the head of the family on a place traditionally reserved for the patriarch in both the colonial and post-colonial periods" (Indra Devi, 220).

Both her brothers Narsi and Narayan soon get jobs and "Akhila felt the iron bands around her chest begin to loosen Dare I breathe again? Dare I dream again? Now that the boys are men, can I start feeling like a woman again?" (77). These thoughts throw light on the fact that Akhila was not given access to any kind of fanciful notions and all her feminine dreams were nipped in the bud. A brief love affair with a much younger man also turns out to be futile because more than her own urges she is concerned about what people will think or say. She finds life working its own mechanical way.

Although the bread earner, she was not recognized and designated the status of being the real 'head of the family'. Any person that she came across was deeply rooted within the patriarchal order and refused to look beyond it. Finally wanting to cool her nerves, she boards the train to Kanyakumari, a perfect setting for the unburdening of memories.

The second character Margaret Shanthi is a victim of male domination. Her husband Ebenezer Paulraj who represents the class of colonizers treats his wife like a door mat. A gold medalist and teacher of Chemistry, she fails to comprehend the deep-rooted male egoism within the persona of Ebe. Although hurt very often, she would say, "He was Ebe. My Ebe. He was right. He was always right" (109).

The male chauvinist that Ebe was, he interfered with everything including her career, higher education, choice of food, her hair style, how she dressed etc. She was shattered when he forced her to abort their first baby. Now it was time for Margaret to act and take her sweet revenge. For all the insults, she retaliated it with flattery. She fed him with fatty food, till he turned obese and almost good for nothing. Dr. Varalakshmi confides, "By making him fat she erodes his self-esteem and feels he is an easy man to live with now, in and out of health institute. Margaret gains self-esteem by eroding Ebe's self-esteem. She succeeds in achieving her emotional fulfillment keeping the family ties intact" (69).

Margaret Shanti is a representative of all those women who seek some kinds of praise and appreciation from their male counterpart. But the typical Chauvinism of Ebenezer makes him turn a blind eye to all the worthiness of his wife. She blindly adores him and so swallows all his insults till the following words unconsciously rise within her "I hate him. I hate him5' (131). To all the humiliation, she uses flattery as a weapon. This she uses very shrewdly and effectively till his ego and self-esteem ebbs down.

Through the character of Prabha Devi, Anita Nair hints at the gender discrimination which begins from the cradle. The news of the birth of Prabha is denounced by her father in the following words: "Has this baby, apart from ruining my business plans addled your brains as well? If you ask me, a daughter is a bloody nuisance" (169).

As a child she is encouraged to play games suitable for a girl and as she grows up is groomed to be the perfect wife and home-maker.

However, as she grows up finds life very monotonous and refuses to define life in a mechanical way. Acknowledging her own weakness and timidity, she decides to flow along with the tide rather than being cast away on the banks.

Every Indian parent is more concerned about the male child when compared to the female child; and every home has different rules for them. The character of Prabha Devi is used to emphasis the distinction

made between children of different gender. Although Prabha Devi's father is unhappy at her birth, her mother appears rather pleased. For her, a daughter is a person who would continue living the words, thoughts and deeds of the mother, even after she is gone. She is happy that there is someone to wear her jewellery and take her recipes to the other house. Prabha's mother loved her and preferred her company to that of all her four sons. Inspite of all this concern and love for the daughter, she also realizes that a woman is not supposed to voice her concern or opinion. She "had discovered that a woman with an opinion was treated like a bad smell, to be shunned" (170). Prabha Devi is presented as a woman with her share of virtues and vices, but Anita Nair shows great respect towards this personality

The youngest co-passenger is Sheela, fourteen years old, who held her grandmother in high esteem as she considered her the manifestation of feminity. The issue of female child abuse is brought out very aptly, through the character of Sheela. The need to assert the individuality of the self is finely portrayed here. It was Hasina's (Sheela's friend) father who tried to mess with her physically. "For no reason he touched her. One Sunday afternoon when Sheela went to their house, rushing in from the heat with a line of sweat beading her upper lip, Nazar (Hasina's father) reached forward and wiped it with his forefinger. The touch of his finger tingled on her skin for a longtime" (66). Sheela was unable to talk to anybody about this but not to be bogged down by this incident, she decides to protect herself from such incidents and from people like Nazar is future. As a preliminary precaution, "Sheela mopped her face with a hanky each time she entered Hasina's home" (66). She also observed that Hasina and her mother were hurt by what Nazar did. Here Sheela, although very young and nai've took the right decision. She decided never to go to her friend's house again. This was a decision taken to protect herself from further physical touch and his family from humiliation.

Thus, she exhibits indomitable courage and great strength in her defiance against physical abuse. Within the story of Sheela is intertwined yet another story of a young girl Celine who falls prey to a man's lust, the consequence of which is an unwanted pregnancy. Through these incidents Anita Nair brings out the atrocities meted out on helpless women.

The next woman is Marikolanthu who cuts a very pathetic picture. Being oppressed right from the childhood, she never raised her voice or objected to any decision taken in her matter. She is not sent to study at the town school for her mother thinks, "It's not just the money but how can I send a young girl by herself, there is too much of risk" (215).

All her childhood innocence and gentleness is shattered with the physical brutality upon her by Murugesan. Least concerned about the infliction upon her tender mind, her mother is worried about who would marry her. Nobody sympathize with her and instead quip, "The girl must have led him on and now that she is pregnant, she's making up a story about rape" (245). The physical brutality leaves such an ugly scar upon her that it evokes a strong sense of aversion towards her son. Defining herself as an independent woman, she does not consider it significant to have the presence of a man in her life. Wresting with life, she experiences a kind of happiness and is being content with herself.

The older women in the house feel that an unmarried woman's life is incomplete as there is none to protect her otherwise, she should be financially secure as a good job is a near compensation to 'male protection'. This incident makes Marikolanthu fear the institution of marriage and decides not to be tied down to the dictates of any man. She wrestles with life and not wanting to be a burden upon anyone takes up to working as a domestic maid. This is her definition of an independent status and appears content with herself.

Karpagam is the embodiment of sheer courage and determination. Although a widow her sense of dressing and appearance do not display the same. She stands as a representative of all women seeking to define themselves in the patriarchal social order. Her 'I care less' attitude is displayed when she blunts, "I don't care what my family or anyone thinks. I am who I am. And I have as much right as anyone else to live as I choose" (202).

This woman is an embodiment of great mental courage. Her words, "Tell me didn't we as young girls wear colourful clothes and jewellery and a bottu? It has nothing to do with whether she is married or not and whether her husband is alive or dead. Who made these laws anyway? Some man who couldn't bear the thought that in spite of his death, his wife continued to be attractive to other men" (202) is truly thought provoking. One cannot help but wonder at the significance of her words. There is no hypocrisy or falsehood in what she says but every word uttered is true to the core.

She stands as the spokesman of Anita Nair and lends words to her voice while saying, "I live alone. I have for many years now. We are strong Akhi. Whatever you think you want to. Live alone. Build a life for yourself where your needs come first" (202).

It is Karpagam's words which instil a strong desire within Akila to live life on her own terms. She is wonderstruck at the powerful words uttered by Karpagam and says, "Karpagam are you real or are you some goddess who had come here to lead me out of this..." (202).

Therefore, it would not be wrong to say that Nair has done full justice in portraying the character of Karpagam, who succeeds in breaking through the shackles of the patriarchal order while asserting her rights.

These are the six women who share their lives with each other in the ladies coupe and permit us a glimpse within their private arena. The revelation of each one's life actually enlightens the others. Akhila is greatly surprised to realize her empowered self and seeks to rediscover her life and reclaim her lost love.

One question keeps looming large throughout the novel and that is Can a women survive alone? The answer is a definite 'Yes'. The security and care provided by marriage very often is nothing but an illusion. Every woman possesses the strength to live life as per her own terms and conditions. However, many of them do not realize their inner strengths. Many others fail to acknowledge due to the pressure of the social norms. Very often it takes a Karpagam to help other women visualize things in the right perspective.

There are a few other minor characters who but strongly portray the patriarchal order and the myriad socio-political economic restrictions upon women. One such character is Akhila's mother who is not only a devoted wife and mother but also very conservative and orthodox in her upbringing and thinking. She not only believed but also supported the concept of women's subordination and inferior status. She also believed that women are not capable of talking their own decisions for that is entirely a man's forte. Her simple theory of life is, "A good wife learnt to put her husband's interests before anyone else's even her father's. A good wife listened to her husband and did as he said. It is best to accept that the wife is inferior to the husband. That way, there can be no strife, no disharmony. It is so much easier and simpler to accept one's station in life and live accordingly" (14). She remembers the words of her husband when there were first married and hence has never violated his' advice'. She reminds Akhila of the same when she suggests to her mother to take music lessons. "I want my wife to take care of my children and me. I don't want her so caught up with her job that she has no time for the house or for taking care of my needs" (14).

Even after the death of Akhila's father, circumstances force Akhila to take up a job. Although the sole provider of the family, her mother does not permit her to take any decision regarding the family or herself, for according to her decision making is the sole domain and authority of a man.

Anita Nair's voyage in life has also been long. Moving on from being a journalist to the world of advertisement, films and then actually becoming a writer, Nair has voyaged life on her own terms and conditions and appears truly content.

When asked what she aims to portray through her writings, she says, "See, it's not really an issue I'm trying to answer. Only that I try to understand what disturbs me, be it things to me or things and people around me. And by the time, I finish writing a book, I know there are some answers that I'll have" (Outlook).

Nair does not aim at preaching or moralizing issues. She is sure that there are certain virtues and strengths deeply instilled within each person. She only aims at helping each character achieve this. She confesses that although she is not a feminist, she is aware of the quality of strength in a woman. Very often strength is not associated as a feminine quality. But then there is a lot of strength in a woman that does not come out naturally. Only some event, person or circumstances into which she is thrown actually force out this quality.

Nair is happy being a writer. Writing for her is both a necessity and addiction. She says, "The best thing about being a writer is to be anonymous in one's writing, being genderless, ageless, and classless. It's a challenge writing about people completely different from myself and my kind of life" (Cafedilli.com). Anita Nair is a fine writer with an eye for telling details which can move from tender compassion to sensuality, from subtle emotions to raging hatred.

This compelling teller of stories "like a rag picker with an eagle eye, she (Nair) observes the ordinary lives of maid-servants, masseurs, vendors and other women who course through daily life. It is the strength and resilience of the everyday woman that Nair brings out...Nair's women are fleshed out to the last detail. You can visualize them clearly- their faces, their bones, their desires..."

Ladies Coupe is a masterpiece by Anita Nair, a prolific writer. This novel presents the life of 6 women, all caught in the flux of tradition and the social order. The patriarchal society into which they are born places a number of hurdles and obstacles in the path of their smooth progress. The future appears bleak and dark with an air of nothingness being spread about. With great courage and determination the women face the odds and even fight them out. The journey undertaken by the women is not only a physical one but more emotional in nature, at the end of which each has a better understanding about themselves. This voyage also helps in the realisation of the self and many other things not comprehended so far.

Nair deals with the various problems of women and takes up all those issues that most women would not dare to voice in public. Some of the issues that she so skillfully deals with are gender discrimination, lust, the 'male-made' society, breaking the patriarchal order and much more. All women face similar problems all around. However, things are especially difficult for those coming from the lower strata of the society. Those coming from the upper class and those financially independent definitely find things easier. A woman in spite of all her talents and skills has to work twice as hard to prove her credentials, and in spite of all her struggle and endeavor is in the least appreciated.

Nair successfully provides a glimpse into the women's world. The female psyche and the feminine experience are brought out very successfully. The women that Nair portrays are distinct and different from those of the past. The prevailing social structure, economic condition, modern education and

western influence have all helped women to change her attitude, her way of thinking and her total persona. Successfully coming out of the traditional wraps, the effects of the change in women is seen in almost every sphere of human activity. This change has greatly influenced the man-woman relationship too. This was one area not fully explored and people shied away from bringing private and personal issues into public. This positive change in women is helping them to define and redefine themselves in a positive way.

Another interesting thing that Nair tries to do is giving her women a solution to the many problems they face. She is of the opinion that if problems arise, solutions cannot be far behind. Being a believer in traditional values, her women are also true propagators of values and ethics. Inspite of having marital problems, they realise that it is not so easy to break up marital ties and go against social order. Not willing to mar things, they look at it with a new sense of interest giving it a different dimension altogether. It is the attitude of the Indian society with its mindset that Nair's women wish to break through. They rebel and revolt (very often silently), but not to break or undo the social order. Living within the frame work of the society with its values, morals, ethics and tradition, they crave and carve an identity for themselves by asserting for equal rights and opportunity.

Every writer has a message which is brought out through their composition. Nair is no exception. She has a lot to say to her readers.

A very, superficial reading of the novel 'Ladies Coupe' brings to fore the following elements: the predicament of women, her awareness of the same, her desire to be recognized as a person and not merely a woman, and her urge to have an independent identity.

However, on reading the novel with a deep insight one realizes that there is much more. A woman who is the sheer embodiment of patience and selflessness is ready to make numerable sacrifice and all that she seeks in return is her husband's trust and appreciation, children's unconditional love, parent's lifelong support and the companionship of friends. "It is necessary for women to live within relationship. But if the rules are rigidly laid that as a wife or mother you do this and no further, then one becomes unhappy" (Vishwanathan, 230).

Nair's message to her women and readers at large is very similar to that of Shashi Deshpande who borrows the words from the Dhammapada in her novel The Dark Holds No Terrors.

You are your own refuge

There is no other refuge

This refuge is hard to achieve (The Dhammapada).

Nair's objective and message is that every woman should seek to find a refuge within themselves, and not elsewhere. Every woman is strong enough to assert and ascertain that she has a solution to all her problems, instead of being subjugated and subordinated by someone. One needs to have a balanced and practical approach towards life and keep working at the wheels of life to keep it going.

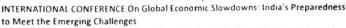

Abstract

Although India has a rich and long history of environmental laws dating back to the 1970s, it still ranks very low on air and water pollution levels compared to the rest of the world resulting in. higher rates of infant mortality and lower life expectancy rates. Poor sanitation conditions and sewage problems compound the problem affecting the health of ordinary citizens in India. The reasons for this disconnect between enlightened environmental laws and high levels of pollution could be traced to lax enforcement of existing environmental laws, discrepancies in the environmental guidelines for businesses to follow between the central government and at the state levels, and the existence of a large number of SMEs who neither have the resources nor the technical skills to adhere to the existing environmental laws. Using extensive secondary research, this paper suggests a series of steps to help the country achieve safe air and water pollution levels resulting in improved health conditions for its citizens. The cornerstone of the prescription for improvements in the environment is a collaborative arrangement that brings together the various government agencies, the citizens, SMEs, large domestic companies, and NGOs to participate in a collaborative arrangement to educate, streamline effective policies, develop the necessary institutional infrastructure, and provide adequate funding for improving the environment.

India is not the only country facing environmental issues. Definitely air and water pollution and climate change are more global issues that require a concerted effort by all nations to solve. A report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) in "Climate Change Science Compendium" 2009", suggests that the world will be experiencing more of ocean acidification, ice-sheet melting, sealevel rise, and so-called tipping points in climate effects much sooner than ever thought off (Parks, 2009). Although environmental issues are global in nature, each country is in control of its own environment with jurisdiction over its territory and, hence, should be controlling, monitoring, and enacting regulations in safeguarding its environment. This is true for India too. The Copenhagen Accord makes it clear that it is up to individual countries to devise and enforce the regulations necessary to achieve their national commitments to combat global warming by reducing greenhouse gas emissions. Because of the country specific role of controlling and monitoring the environment, it is difficult to enforce environmental standards on countries from a global perspective, each country should be willing to consider environmental issues as a probable contributor to the overall global degradation of the environment and participate in controlling it through its laws and participation by its industrial sector. In addition, each country could be part of a worldwide association/organization that uses the global network, technological know-how, and resources to be a contributing partner to this group in helping the environment (like the Kyoto Protocol of 1997 and Copenhagen Accord of 2009 on climate change). When international organizations and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) try to help individual countries on environmental issues, in some instances it creates

problems. In a research paper funded and supported by the World Bank, researchers found that in India, the role of international institutions and NGO's often have difficulty matching their interest with that of the state, especially, when it comes to human rights standards (Randeria, 2003).

Environmental Issues Facing India

Some of the major environmental concerns confronting India include: * Air pollution from industrial effluents and vehicle emissions; * Energy-related environmental problems such as, chemical & oil pollution and Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions (Greenstone and Hanna, 2014); * Water pollution from raw sewage, the lack of adequate sanitation, and no potable water throughout the country; Municipal solid waste management (MSWM) remains a challenge for India due to the rising population and the resultant infrastructural needs (Dube, Nandan, and Dua, 2014); * Over-population and its strain on natural resources; and * Agricultural factors such as, runoff of agricultural pesticides, overgrazing, short cultivation cycles, slash and burn practices, destructive logging practices, and deforestation of timber reserves for fuel, all contribute conjointly to the decimation of the subcontinent's environmental system (Greenstone and Hanna, 2014). In particular, municipal solid waste (MSW) collection and disposal is a major urban environmental problem facing India. India is not the only country with this problem, it appears many of the developing countries and a few of the developed countries are also confronted with MSW as an environmental concern. But, in India the critical concern is in the way MSW is disposed. The waste that is collected by municipalities in India is simply dumped on the outskirts of the urban centers (Reddy, 2014). In addition, the MSW release methane and carbon dioxide that increase the effects of greenhouse gases. On environmental issues and concerns, India carries a heavier burden because it is generally accepted that pollutant concentrations are exceedingly high in many developing countries imposing substantial health costs and shortened lives (Chen, et. al., 2013). Since most of the growth in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions is projected to occur in developing countries such as China and India, these two countries are probably responsible for the future of this world. In the most recent data available, ambient particulate matter concentrations in India are five times the level of concentrations in the United States and China's are seven times the U.S. level (Greenstone, 2014). Interestingly, in anticipation of the Paris Conference on climate change that is scheduled to start on November 30th, countries have been issuing pledges about how much emission they are willing to cut in coming decades. India and Brazil, probably the two of the most air polluting countries in the world have yet to make commitments to take to the Paris Conference (Gillis and Sengupta, 2015).

Results and effects of environmental issues in India Many of the current environmental concerns in India such as the air pollution, GHG emissions, chemical and oil pollution, etc., have many far reaching consequences for its people. The two major areas of concerns for policy makers are high infant mortality rates and low life expectancy. As shown in Table 1, for the year 2013, out of 1,000 live births in India about 41 will die before they reach the age of 5. By comparison, in China only II die and in Japan and Singapore only 2 will not survive beyond the age of 5. Similarly, India is ranked 139th among 194 countries in life expectancy with people living up to 66 years of age. By comparison, people in Japan on an average live up to 84, in Singapore up to 83, and in China they live up to 75 (Table 1). The link between environmental concerns, its effects on people, and the resulting consequences on human life and the economy are easily traceable. Higher the environmental destruction greater the health problems faced by the people resulting in both human and economic costs. Figure I maps out the link between environmental concerns, effects of these concerns, and the resulting human and economic toll on a country.

Environmental Regulations In India

Indian government has shown some foresight in the area of environmental concerns by enacting legislations meant to protect the environment. India has about two hundred laws dealing with

environmental protection (www.cpreec.org). India's environmental regulations date back to the 1970s. The first important regulation enacted was the Water Act of 1974 followed by the Air Act of 1981. These acts created the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) responsible for data collection and policy enforcement. It also developed detailed procedures for environmental compliance at the central government level. Simultaneously, a second control board at the state level called State Pollution Control Board (CPCB) was also established to collect data and for policy enforcement at the state level. These were followed by other regulations meant to protect the environment. India's key policies relating to environmental protection are governed by: * The national forest policy, 1988; * Policy statement for abatement of pollution, 1992; and * National conservation strategy and policy statement on environment and development, 1992. Hence, it is clear that the current environmental problems in India are not due to a lack of legislation, but there appears to be other factors that are contributing to the current situation.

Conclusion

The rapid economic growth experienced by India is resulting in adverse and harmful environmental conditions that are affecting the people of India as well the wider global population. In the case of India, this is further exacerbated by the high population density and growth rates. The existing environmental laws, although cover a wide spectrum of environmental concerns, they seem to be ineffective due to lack of enforcement, the lack of resources, and technical challenges faced by a large number of Indian companies, especially the SMEs. Under these conditions, India has to adopt some sustainable actions that need to address the myriad issues facing the country including environmental degradation in order to sustain its prospects for continued economic growth (Ranganath, 2015). Sustainable development, that is, both a prosperous economy and a healthy environment that in many respects is the goal of diverse interest in the area of environmental issues, is the key for the future of India and the world. Sustainable development implies managing the diverse interests of a prosperous economy and simultaneously maintaining a healthy environment. Based on extensive literature search, we recommend that India undertake a new approach in the fight against environmental pollution. The key element of this new initiative is the shared and cooperative participation of the people, the government, the industrial sector, and NGO's. This type of approach seems to have worked for a few countries and it appears to be a doable solution for India too. A series of steps are recommended that could lead to an improved environment and at the same time prove to be helpful for the Indian population. Furthermore, to reduce the growing MSW problem, it is recommended that India undertake proven waste to energy conversion techniques that have been adopted by the European Union.
